FIREMEN TEST WATER SUPPLY IN NEARBY TOWNS

Fire Chief James Fletcher and other members of the Roseburg fire department drove to Sutherlin and Oakland last night to test the water supply of those cities. The test was made to provide the department with needed information in the event either of the towns should at some time have a serious fire which might necessitate calling upon Roseburg for help. The data secured will enable the department to know what equipment to use, and will save the time of experimenting when immediate action might be necessary. Oakland has a water pressure of 80 pounds with a flow of 750 gallons per minute, while Sutherlin has a pressure of 60 pounds with a flow of 750 gallons per minute. It would be possible to use the big pump in either town and in the event of an emergency the big engine would be taken out on the run.
