\$3,000,000 MEMORIAL REARED IN INDIANA

INDIANAPOLIS, July 1.—To its sons and daughters who served in the World War Indiana will dedicate a shrine, the cornerstone of which will be laid July 4 by General John J. Pershing.

The \$3,000,000 edifice is the central structure in a war memorial plaza a block wide, reaching northward for half a mile from the city's business district.

Completion of the central shrine will give Indianapolis and Indiana one of the most notable war memorials in the nation. The long hall, bordered by the James Whitcomb Riley memorial library and the federal courthouse and post-office building, already contains the national headquarters building of the American Legion.

The project is a joint undertaking of the city, county and state.

Education Worth Money to Farmers, Agriculture Bureau Survey Shows

The value of an education in dollars and cents has been determined to be \$25 for each day's schooling in the case of farmers. The more education a farmer has had the more money he makes, the department of agriculture has decided after surveys in 12 widely separated states.

Analysis shows that the years spent in high school and college are repaid by greater earning capacity when farm activities are undertaken and that even common-school education is distinctly more advantageous financially than no school education at all.

The monetary value of an education was arrived at by agricultural extension workers by taking \$20,000 as the total earnings of an uneducated laborer over a 40-year period and \$40,000 as the total earnings of a high-school graduate who spent twelve years of approximate 180 days each in acquiring training. The gain in wages, \$20,000, due to these 2,160 days of school, represents a value of \$9.25 a day during the period of schooling.

The net annual profits of farmers in Georgia without any schooling was found to average \$240, while those who had common-school education earned \$565.50, high-school graduates \$843.50 and those who completed an agricultural-college course earned \$1,254. Those who had taken only a short course earned \$895.95, or almost three times as much as those with no education at all.

In Indiana, Illinois, Iowa and Kansas the surveys showed again that the men with the best training made the largest incomes. In Missouri the better educated men own four-fifths of the land they operate, keep more livestock, handle more crops with each workman and do about one-fifth more business.

Farmers in Wisconsin with a high-school education acquired the ownership of their farms in about seven years, while it took 10 years for those with only a common-school education to acquire a clean title.

No. 25 for both Babe and Lou came in the same games yesterday and went a long way to help the Yankees to win, 13 to 6 from the Red Sox.

In second place, with the White Sox third, the Washington Senators clinched the contender position by downing the Athletics for the second time in two days, 6 to 5.

Another rising threat appeared in the Detroit Tigers who were in fifth place but only a jump or two behind the White Sox and Athletics.

The Indians' crack pitcher, George Uhle, again proved no puzzle to the Tigers as they won from him 6 to 5, for the fifth time this season.

Al Thomas' tight pitching kept the White Sox in the running with a 5 to 1 victory over the Browns.

National league clubs succeeded in getting exactly nowhere although two games were played in that circuit, the Giants and Braves breaking even in a double header. Scoring five runs in each of the last two innings the Giants won the second game, 11 to 6, after losing the first by 6 to 1.
