HEAVY PENALTIES FOR INSTIGATORS OF VIENNA RIOTS

(Associated Press London Wire)

VIENNA, July 20—Now that order has been restored after the serious rioting that broke out in Vienna Friday, the authorities are seeking to punish the instigators. Nearly 300 persons have been arrested, and of these 75 have already been brought before the courts for preliminary examination. Heavy penal sentences will be given to those found guilty of participating in an uprising, which it was announced, resulted in the death of 87 persons, the wounding of 400, and damage to public and private property estimated at millions of dollars.

To prevent a recurrence of the disorders, the authorities gave instructions that the funeral today of those killed in the rioting must be private.

Apart from the material damage wrought by the infuriated crowds, government leaders and financiers are beginning to count the loss of damaged prestige abroad. In this connection Finance Minister Kienboeck is of the opinion that the Austrian bank rate will rise one per cent. The three day tip of the railroads is believed to have cost the companies about two millions in revenue. It has been announced that parliament will meet Monday.

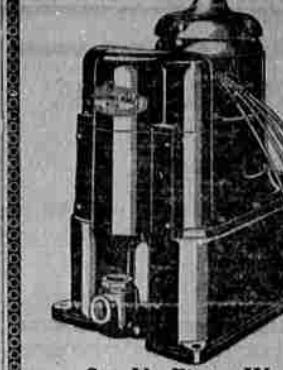

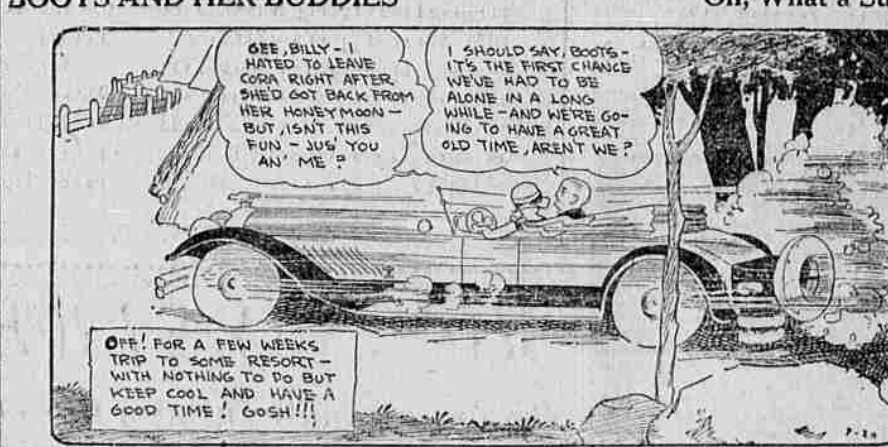

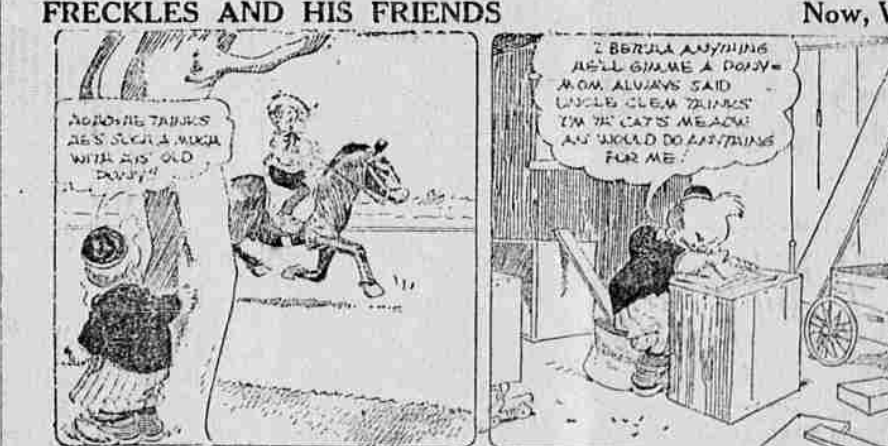
