## STATE OF OREGON HEIR TO PORTLAND PROPERTY

PORTLAND, Ore., July 29.—The old Mulkey building property at the northeast corner of Second and Morrison streets, valued in excess of \$150,000, will eventually fall into the hands of the state of Oregon, the gift of the late Frank M. Mulkey, old time Portland attorney, who died July 24.

Under Mulkey's will, admitted to probate today, the state will receive the property subject to the life interest of Chester V. Dolph, Portland attorney, and Marshall R. Armstrong, cousin of Mulkey. In his will, dated June 22, 1925, Mulkey expressed the hope that the state may "at a convenient and opportune time not too far in the future construct and maintain a suitable office building for the housing of state offices and activities, and that it be dedicated by appropriate ceremony to the permanent and lasting memory of my brother, Ex-Senator Frederick W. Mulkey, now deceased, in appreciation of his unselfish and untiring labor and devotion to the city, county and state he loved so well."

He was arrested last week in San Francisco.

## AMEE McPHERSON TO QUIT ANGELUS TEMPLE PULPIT

work, the evangelist said she had made her choice and would leave Los Angeles.

Plans "Lighthouse" Previously she had announced plans to change Angelus Temple to the Four Square Lighthouse, with branches in cities throughout the United States and herself as advisor of the religious fleet they would represent.

Denver, Chicago and New York, she said last night, will be the principal centers of her new work. "It will be necessary for me to remain in charge until the unfortunate difficulties between the church and my mother have been amicably settled," Mrs. McPherson said. "I am hoping that a new head can be found and the church difficulties be straightened out during the next three weeks."

Rev. Martin Craig of Des Moines, Iowa, may be the choice of the retiring pastor as her successor. "It seems that ever since I escaped from those who kidnapped me I have been the center of a storm created by outside influences," Mrs. McPherson said. "Through their heeding of me they have imperiled the wonderful institution we have built thru the years of devotion and effort."

Field International Denver, she said, had started a movement to found a temple similar to Angelus Temple, where she would appear periodically. The same plan would be followed in Chicago and New York. From these points her organization would extend throughout the United States and into foreign countries.

At least three Canadian cities, including Toronto and Montreal, would build permanent temples, or "lighthouses." England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales would be in her program of expansion. She said she had not yet revealed her plans to either her mother, her congregation or the church committee which backed her in her present struggle with her mother, but she would do so today.

A new mystery in temple affairs which was injected into the squabble between mother and daughter when the evangelist's committee said that Mrs. Kennedy was the wife of W. Whitebeck, of New York, still was unexplained last night. Mrs. Kennedy, when told Whitebeck denied he was married to her or even knew her, refused to comment.

Commenting today on her daughter's declaration to resign, Mrs. Kennedy said: "There's no reason to be alarmed. This is at least the sixth time that she has said she would resign."

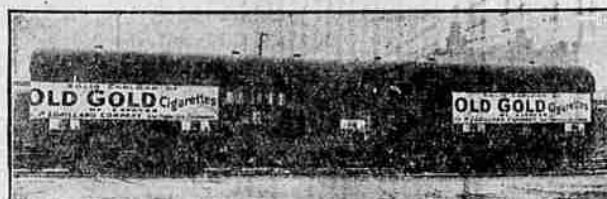

Mrs. Kennedy was referring to her daughter's statement of last night in which Mrs. McPherson admitted that "outside influences are pushing, heckling her."

"That is what I have said from the start," Mrs. Kennedy said. "I've known it for months."

The evangelist's kidnapping story of last summer coincided with her disappearance on May 15, 1926, from Santa Monica Beach. She turned up in the Mexican border town of Douglas, Arizona, June 23, over a month later, declaring she had escaped from three kidnapers who had been holding her.
