DEMPSEY-TUNNEY TICKET SALE HAS PASSED MILLION

CHICAGO, Aug. 16.—The Illinois supreme court of justices, the state athletic commission, today took up the public's side in the forthcoming heavyweight championship battle, scanning the blue prints which show how Tex Rickard proposes to seat 160,000 or more in the Soldier Field stadium September 22.

Whatever the commissioners say today, on the number of seats and the price the public will pay for them, will define the limits of Rickard's new record in fight crowds and gate receipts. Nearly a million and a quarter dollars already has been placed in ticket orders, with the demand increasing. Apparently Rickard will easily be able to sell all the tickets the commission will give him permission to print.

Rickard's last minute revision of the plan, before submitting it to Chairman John C. Rieheimer, and Commissioners Paul Prehen and O. W. Huncke, were to increase the extent of the cheaper prices seating sections.

Having invited the New York promoter to bring Tunney and Dempsey here, bending their regulation to give him a \$40 top and a millionaire coal man for legal sponsor, the commission is expected to endorse Rickard's plan without much change and allow the ticket sale to start.

C. E. CONFERENCE BE HELD AT TURNER AUGUST 29-SEPT. 5

Oregon's 8th annual Summer Conference will be held at Turner, Oregon, August 29 to September 5. Turner is on the main Southern Pacific line, 10 miles south of Salem.

The conference committee consists of Miss Lucy Walker, of Forest Grove, general chairman; Miss Josephine Bothman, of Corvallis, publicity manager; Mr. Dallas Rice, of Portland, business manager; Miss Viola Ogden, of Portland, registrar; and Rev. Walter L. Myers, of Eugene Bible University, Dean.

One of the interesting special speakers will be Mr. Zenos Olden, of Hillsboro, former president of Washington Christian Endeavor Union and high school teacher in Hillsboro, who is home on furlough from Bangalore, India. Some interesting features of the conference will be reports from the recent International Convention at Cleveland by Oregon delegates, evening bonfire meetings under the leadership of Paul Brown; stunt night, and the annual conference banquet.

Advance registration received at Christian Endeavor headquarters, 303 Abington building, Portland, indicate a state wide interest in the coming conference as delegates have registered from Pendleton, Forest Grove, La Grande, Eugene, and Ashland, as well as many other towns closer in. 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GEORGE GODFREY K. O.'S MALONEY

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 16.—The shadow of George Godfrey, giant negro fighter of Leipsville, Pa., loomed large on the pugilistic horizon today, while Jim Maloney, Boston heavyweight, slipped farther back in the ranks of those seeking the championship crown.

Godfrey dropped the Boston strong boy for the fatal count last night after one minute and twenty five seconds of fighting. Maloney landed several blows to head and body, but they did not stop the 223-pound Godfrey as he waded in with fists flying. Maloney was driven to the ropes and as Godfrey shifted he sent a crushing left hook to the Boston man's jaw. Maloney pitched headlong to the canvas and still was unconscious several minutes after he had been counted out.

TRAP-SHOOTERS OF AMERICA WILL VIE THIS MONTH

DAYTON, Ohio, 16.—Trapshooters are wondering if Charles A. Young of Springfield, O., the farmer who set a world's trapshooting record last year, can again blaze his way to the championship.

Young broke all of the 100 targets. This was the second time he made a perfect score in a national meet.

The record was made at Vandellia, ten miles north of here, where the "clay busters" will gather August 22-27, for the twenty-eighth Grand American championship and handicap tournament of the Amateur Trapshooting Association of America.

Prices for the event will total close to \$20,000. The Grand American handicap purse alone is worth \$10,525. It will be shot August 26.

They still talk about Charles Young's feat last year, as he stood there calmly "potting 'em" one after another, apparently as nervous and steady as a machine.

He is the only other man who broke a hundred in the Grand American handicap was Riley Thompson shooting at Chicago in 1910, but he was four yards nearer the traps than Young.

Young's first perfect score was made at Peru, Ind. His record is unsurpassed in the history of trapshooting.
