TOKYO, Japan, Aug. 25.—An earthquake at Tsinan, in the Chinese province of Shantung, in which ten persons were killed and more than 100 injured, is reported in a message to the Nishi Nishi Shinbun. About 200 houses are said to have been destroyed.  
The city of Tsinan, which has a population of about 620,000, is the capital of the province of Shantung. It is at the terminus of the Shantung railway and is an important station on the Tientsin-Pukow line.

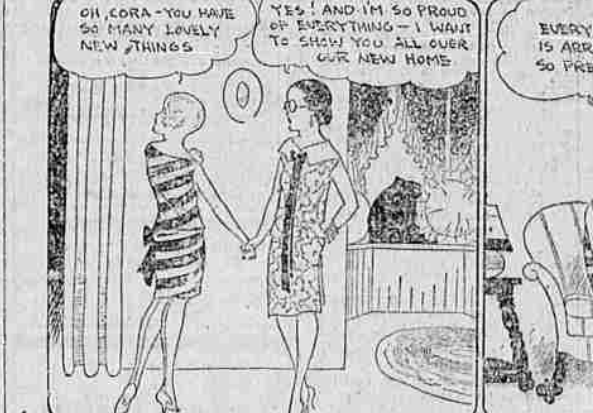
## SECRETARYS DEMPSEY'S WORK

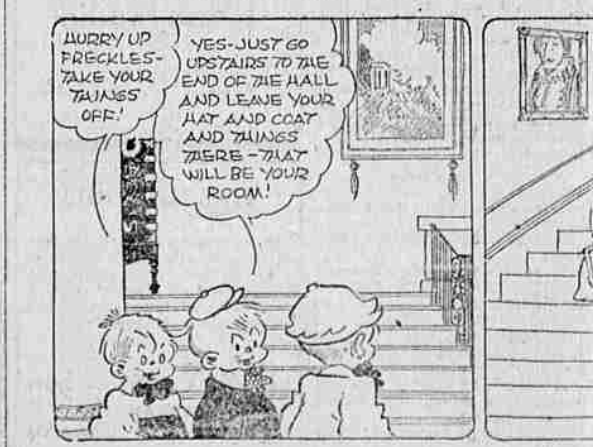

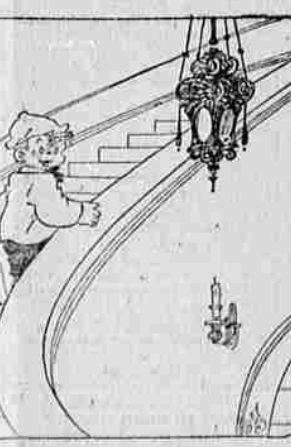

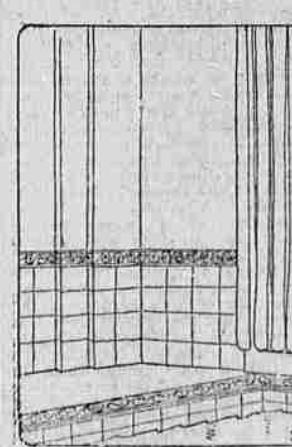
