SUTHERLIN HAS VISION OF EAST AND WEST RAILROAD

Sutherland is quite excited over prospects of an east and west railroad through that place. At several times parties of surveyors have been seen working in the mountain district east of the town and their presence has resulted in much surmise. The Sutherland Sun comments on the situation as follows:

Much speculation has been aroused here the past week in regard to an engineering crew which has been working for some time through the mountain range east of Sutherland. Rumor has it that the engineers left Bend several weeks ago, since which time they have been gradually working thru the mountain region and big timber toward Sutherland.

There were seven engineers in the party and they carried three tripods and other surveying equipment, and when they emerged from the woods and bushes at the head of Sutherland valley ten days ago with unshaven faces and torn clothes, they had the appearance of having been long isolated from the haunts of man.

At the upper end of the valley they telephoned to Roseburg for an automobile, which arrived here later and picked them up. On the road three miles east of Sutherland the car was obliged to stop on account of tire trouble, and while the tire was being removed a citizen of Sutherland came along in his car and offered assistance. This was gladly accepted in the form of "stickum" for a patch on an inner tube.

While repairs were being made one of the engineers recognized the Sutherland citizen as an old friend whom he had known years ago in Walla Walla, Wash., and they discussed old times. When the Sutherland man made inquiry however, as to what the engineers were doing in this section, no information was forthcoming. "We are absolutely bound to secrecy as from whence we came or whither we are going," replied the engineer. "It would please me to give an old friend information if I was in a position to do so, but we are all under orders to say nothing," he continued.

A Sutherland man who was returning from the mountains east of Sutherland last Friday evening, passed a half dozen automobiles in the vicinity of Hinkle creek, all containing men who were strangers in this section. The cars were proceeding in the direction of McCollum's old mill, and from equipment noticed on some of the cars the Sutherland citizen is under the impression that the men are surveyors.

It is generally known that an east and west road, through central Oregon is contemplated. Citizens of Grants Pass desire this proposed road to tide water to go through that city, and it is understood that citizens of Roseburg are also interested in having the road enter the country east toward the fact that the engineers have been working on a route east of Sutherland and the further fact that there is approximately 11 miles of standard roadbed running east and west through this valley, ready for ties and rails, would indicate that Sutherland is being considered as a route for the proposed road. The roadbed running east and west through Sutherland valley was built several years ago by the Roach Timber company ostensibly in connection with development of 55,000 acres of timber of the company east of Sutherland, but there has long been a persistent rumor that the Hill interests were interested in this 11 miles of standard railroad grade.
