ZELLERBACH PAPER COMPANY PLANT AT SACRAMENTO RAZED

Fire Destroys Water Front Buildings Injuring 14 Firemen—Fire at Cascade Locks.

(Associated Press Leased Wire) SACRAMENTO, Calif., Sept. 16.—Fire sweeping thru the four-story Zellerbach Paper Company and Ward Seed company buildings on Sacramento's waterfront was believed under control at an early hour this morning with loss placed at more than \$325,000. Fourteen firemen were injured by a falling wall, two seriously. One may die as the result of a fractured skull.

Town Threatened
CASCADIA LOCKS, Ore., Sept. 16.—Fire which for a time threatened the town early today destroyed a restaurant, pool hall and confectionery, housed in a one-story building known as the White House and two unoccupied buildings adjoining. The loss was estimated at about \$5,000. The volunteer fire department, with two lines of hose, fought the fire for four hours, keeping it from spreading. The cause of the fire had not been determined early today. The White House building was owned by Mrs. A. L. Steward.

CONFERENCE OLDER GIRLS IN ROSEBURG OCTOBER 21-23

James H. Price, general secretary of the Oregon Council of Religious Education, arrived in Roseburg today for the purpose of organizing a county council and to make preliminary arrangements for the Older Girls' Conference for Southern Oregon, which is to convene in Roseburg October 21 for a three-day session.

This Older Girls' conference is one of the most important district meetings to be held during the year and will be attended, it is expected by 300 or more girls from all of the cities and towns of the southern portion of the state. Cooperation of Roseburg people in providing accommodations for the visitors will be requested.

An effort is to be made by Mr. Price to organize a county council of religious education for Douglas county. One council is expected to conduct interdenominational and organized Sunday school work of all kinds, sponsoring such things as the week Bible school in conjunction with the public schools, daily devotion Bible schools, county Sunday school rallies, teacher training courses, conferences for older girls and older boys and such other activities of a public, religious nature.

Mr. Price expects to secure today a tentative committee that will take charge of the plans for organization. This committee will arrange to have delegates appointed from each town and city in the county to meet at Roseburg during one of the days of the Older Girls' Conference at which time a permanent organization will be created, if possible. A county convention is planned for next July, at which time it is hoped to have a speaker from the World's Sunday School convention, which is meeting this year in Los Angeles, the first time that the international meeting has been held in the United States for 17 years.
