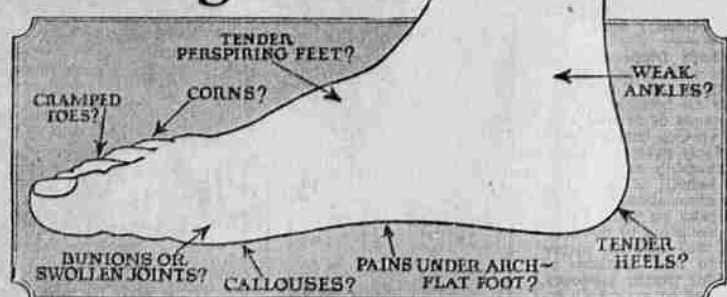

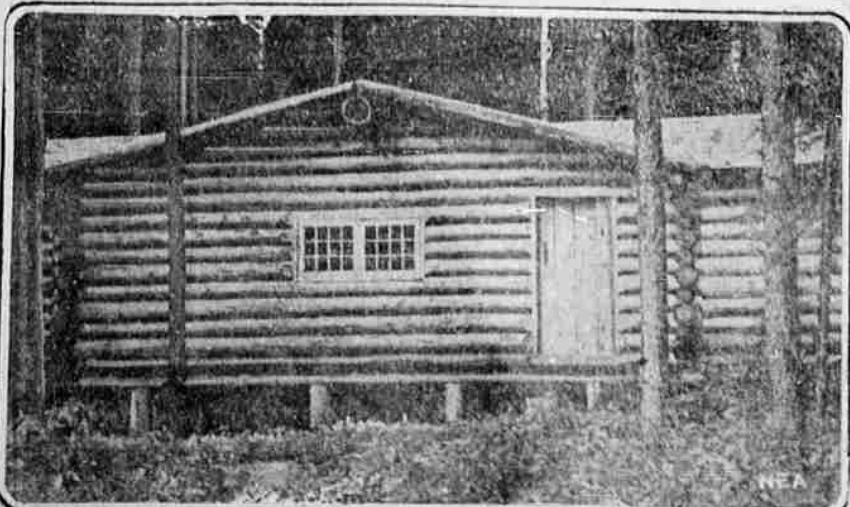
TURKEY GROWERS MEET

SEARCH STARTED FOR PAL OF GIRL WHO WAS INJURED

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 20.—While Inez Frederick, 16, was in a hospital at Hood River, protected from all visitors but members of her family, officers were looking for Alice Walters, 14, who disappeared from her Hood River home Monday at the same time that Inez vanished.

Nothing definite has been disclosed officially to account for the movements of Inez from the time she disappeared until she jumped or fell from a freight train early yesterday at Cascade Locks.

One report said she and the Walters girl had played hooky Monday and went to an orchard to pick apples.

Officers were trying to run down unverified reports concerning the movements of the two girls. Miss Walters is 14 years old, but, according to descriptions furnished by Hood River officials, looks to be about 18, she is rather tall, weighs about 145 pounds. Her hair is light brown and her eyes are hazel. When last seen she was wearing a dark blue flannel "middy." Her complexion is fair.

MIKE ROMANO IS VICTOR IN MATCH
