SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 21.—With six eleven still undefeated in the race for titular honors in the Pacific coast conference, the third week of competition will be ushered in tomorrow by six teams battling for honors.

The Stanford Cardinals, scheduled to meet the Oregon Aggies at Portland will arrive at Multnomah Field this afternoon in time to put in some practice before the fracas tomorrow. Montana will leave today to make the short hop to Moscow to tussle with Idaho, while Washington State College will also leave today for Seattle for the contest with the Washington Huskies.

The California Bears, undefeated in four starts this season thus far, remain at home and take on the Olympic club tomorrow in a practice contest. The University of Southern California will round out the activities of conference members by taking things easy against California Tech at Los Angeles.

## BANDITS ARE GIVEN QUICK PUNISHMENT

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 21.—Federal troops have meted out swift punishment to the bandits who Tuesday morning attacked the Larain, Mexico City passenger train south of San Luis Potosi.

The federal forces pursued the bandits into the mountains. Ten bandits were killed in the battle which followed. Four others were captured and executed on the spot.  
The government stated that the federal forces were still pursuing the remaining members of the band which originally totaled 60.

## PILOT OF HOAX SWIM CONFESSES

LONDON, Oct. 21.—The Daily Sketch today quoted Lieutenant Commander L. S. M. Adams, retired naval officer who acted as pilot for Dr. Dorothy Cechraze Logan in her "hoax channel swim" as declaring that she only confessed to the fake when he and another member of the party which conveyed her, demanded that she do so. Dr. Logan claimed that she had deliberately perpetrated the hoax in order to show the necessity of supervision of such swims. Dr. Logan gravely compromised his honor by continuing to withhold certain facts about the swim. Commander Adams declared, and he therefore decided to make a full statement to the papers. "As I found lies were being told to support her claim that she swam the English Channel, I decided to insist that she make a full confession," he said.

Commander Adams declared that the fact that he and Woodward were under grave suspicion and threatened with serious consequences induced him to make today's statement.

## BRITISH MARRIAGE MARKET IN A SLUMP

LONDON, Oct. 21.—The British marriage market is in a slump. Figures issued by the Registrar-General show that only 14.3 persons per thousand were married in 1926, with the exception of 1927 the lowest recorded in the last 40 years.

The birth rate is the lowest since civil registration was established. The number of children born was 694,563, the lowest total recorded since 1860 when the population was only 19,200,000, about one-half of the population figure for last year.

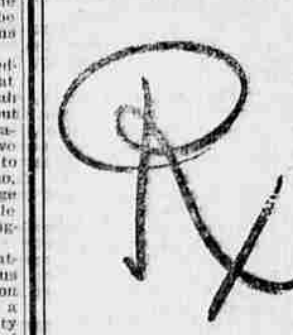
