## FIND CLUES TO MISSING GIRL; MAN IS SOUGHT

Alice Walters, 14-Year-Old  
Hood River Girl Not  
Yet Found.

### HANDBAG IS FOUND

Inez Frederick, Aged 16,  
Still in Hospital Awaiting  
Amputation of  
Three Toes.

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 21.—  
Clues picked up at Cascade Locks  
aided officers in their search for  
Alice Walters, 14 year old Hood  
River girl, who disappeared from  
her home Monday along with Inez  
Frederick. Police were keeping a  
lookout for the Walters girl while  
clues at Cascade Locks were being  
followed.

Inez Frederick, 16, is still in  
Hood River general hospital waiting  
amputation of three toes injured  
when she fell from a freight  
train at Cascade Locks Wednesday  
morning.

A handbag and some clothing be-  
longing to the Walters girl were  
found in an old building at Cascade  
Locks yesterday. There were  
evidences that the two girls had  
lived there awhile.

This brought the theory that  
Inez Frederick might have fallen  
while trying to board the freight,  
instead of jumping or being thrown  
off, as it was thought at first.

Clerks in the Andrews Brothers  
store at Cascade Locks recalled  
yesterday that on Wednesday a  
man and a girl came to the store  
to buy bread. The girl stayed out-  
side while the purchase was being  
made.

Yesterday tracks of a girl's  
shoes were found in the sand along  
the river. Alice Walters' mother  
examined them. She said they  
might have been made by her  
daughter's shoes.

## QUARANTINE IN THE COUNTY BEING STRICTLY ENFORCED

The Douglas county quarantine  
against infantile paralysis is be-  
ing strictly enforced at all the  
boundary lines and Dr. T. W. Lara-  
way, county health officer, is re-  
ceiving splendid cooperation from  
the officers at all quarantine sta-  
tions in the county. Dr. Laraway  
visited the Camas Valley station  
on Wednesday and found severe  
inspection is being made there.  
All cars coming from Coos county  
are being inspected and in the  
event they contain children under  
16 years are turned back.  
As a precautionary measure the  
county health unit has asked all  
communities to keep close watch  
on any one coming into their towns  
by train, helping in the cooper-  
ation of keeping out those from the  
infected areas. Heretofore only  
the towns on the main line of  
travel have been watching for cars  
coming from the infected areas  
but this week the other communi-  
ties were asked to keep close  
track of any one coming in by  
car or train.

No cases have been found in  
Douglas county, although there  
have been new cases discovered in  
surrounding counties. As another  
precautionary measure the county  
has placed a man at Glendale to as-  
sist the constable there in keeping  
watch and this assistant will have  
charge during the night. At all re-  
ports from the quarantine stations  
of any cars coming in from the in-  
fected regions with children under  
18 years old or of any from the  
trains, a strict investigation is  
made by the health department.  
The quarantine at Canyonville  
is being maintained and good co-  
operation with the county is being  
given by that station.
