ANTI-SALCOONERS INCENSED OVER PROHIBITION POLL

(Associated Press Local Wire)

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—A nationwide survey conducted by the National Episcopal Church Temperance society in which 1,932 Episcopal clergymen approved modification of the Volstead Act, was regarded today by Orville S. Poland, counselor to the Anti-Saloon league, as the work of an organization holding only "a parasitic connection" with the Episcopal church, and whose secretary apparently was in the pay of the wet cause.

"If the church temperance society which has published a statement purporting to show that American clergymen are two to one against prohibition, had any official connection with the Episcopal church, I should refuse to comment upon their statement," Poland said. "Bishop Manning some time since made it certain that the so-called church temperance society is no real part of the church but has only a parasitic connection with it."

He declared Dr. James Empringham, who as national secretary of the society took a prohibition poll about two years ago, was apparently on the payroll of the "Association Against the Eighteenth Amendment." He asked the identity of an "anonymous" donor of \$50,000 to the society.

Dr. Empringham when informed of Mr. Poland's statements, said he was not and had never been on the payroll of the association.

**LUMBER MARKET IS
REPORTED BETTER**

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—The "lumber thermometer" of business is encouraging, the National Lumber Manufacturers' association reports. For the week ended October 22, virtually the same number of softwood mills show a gain in current orders and shipments over the preceding week, with production about the same. The current volume of business is greater than a year ago. The hardwood industry also was more active than the previous week, but a little slower than at this time last year. Unfilled orders of 230 southern pine and West Coast mills were \$48,701,309 feet against 559,008,752 for the same number the week before.

CAUSES DEATH**

DALLAS, Ore., Oct. 28.—Still upright in the seat of a wagon, the lifeless body of Herb Parker, 60, farmer of the Baell district, was found when neighbors stopped his runaway team after a runaway of nearly half a mile. Parker was killed by the accidental discharge of his shotgun which apparently slipped from between his knees, the trigger hitting on the wagon tongue and the blast of buckshot tearing off the top of his head. An inquest will not be held. Parker survived by his widow and three children.
