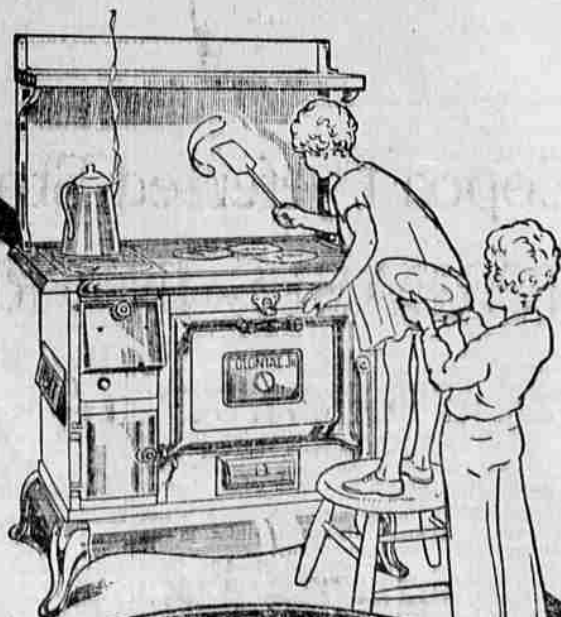

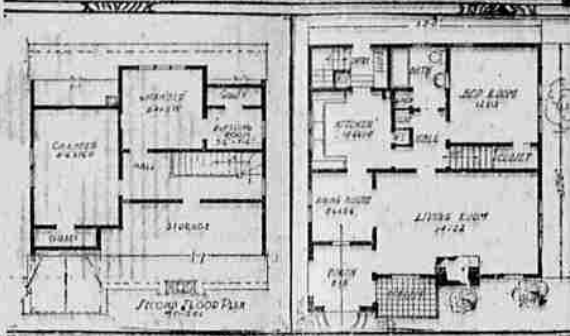
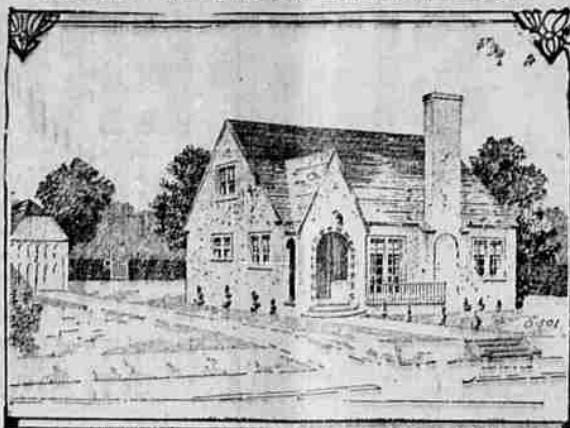

SUMMARY OF SAT- URDAY'S FOOTBALL

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—Hot fights for conference honors and mythical sectional titles all over the country today left college football in the following situation:

East: Princeton, only undefeated and undefeated minor eleven in the section, is out in front with Yale, beaten only by Georgia, close behind. Washington and Jefferson, Pittsburgh, and New York University, have ties alone against them.

Western conference: Illinois has a clean slate with three victories and no defeats in conference battles. Minnesota, tied by Indiana, ranks second.

Southwestern conference: Texas Aggies show the way with two wins and no defeats. Arkansas and Southern Methodist each has been whipped once.

Rocky Mountain conference: Although one loss has been planned on the best in this section, Colorado Aggies, with four successes, have a slight margin on Colorado College and Denver University, winners in three engagements.

Southern conference: Georgia and Tennessee—neither defeated nor tied and both boasting four victories, lead the parade although North Carolina State challenged with three wins.

Pacific Coast: Stanford is a only a slight edge over Southern California in the far west section, boasting three wins to two for the Trojans. Their own meeting was a tie.

DES MOINES, Iowa, Nov. 7.—Chalmers Cissell, former shortstop on the Des Moines Western league baseball team, recently sold by Portland of the Pacific Coast league to the Chicago White Sox, is being sought by Sheriff Park A. Findley.

Cissell has been traced from Portland, Oregon, to St. Paul, but police of the latter city last night had found no trace of him. They detailed officers to watch incoming trains and check hotels.

Cissell is wanted in Polk county on seduction charges preferred by Bernice Ryner, 20 year old telephone operator, who charged that Cissell promised to marry her before leaving for spring training with the Portland club. He was indicted a week ago, and since has been sought without avail in a number of cities.

Cissell's purchase by Chicago is said to have involved \$125,000 in cash and players. He broke into baseball with Des Moines a year ago, and immediately made good, getting his chance with Portland this year.

TO FIND GERMS WITH PHOTOGRAPHS

PARIS, Nov. 7.—A photographic method of determining the existence of tuberculosis in mankind, even when unsuspected, was announced today by Dr. Arthur Vernes, head of the prophylactic institute whose work has been greatly facilitated by large gifts from Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Gould.

Vernes asserted that more than 15,000 tests have verified the accuracy of his method which is based on a photometric test of the blood. Tuberculosis is frequently active when the lungs are entirely free of it, he said.

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PARIS, Nov. 7.—Mrs. Henry Mason Day has instituted divorce proceedings against her husband. It was learned at the Palace of Justice today it is expected that she will be granted a decree within the next few days.

Henry Mason Day is vice president of the Sinclair exploration company and his activities in connection with the Fall-Sinclair conspiracy case are now under investigation in Washington. He is alleged to have been "contact man" between Harry F. Sinclair and Burns detectives, accused of shadowing jurors in the trial.

Mrs. Day, who was Elizabeth de Selding, is well known as a mezzo-soprano, having sung in both New York and Europe. Early in the world war she became a member of Lord Kitchener's recruiting staff. Later she became chairman of the Franco-American music committee for the wounded. The couple have spent much of their time in Europe since their marriage in New York in 1910. Mrs. Day's present residence is given in the social register as Paris.
