PATIENCE SHOULD NOT BE OVERTAXED

In connection with the traffic conditions prevailing as a result of bridge construction activities the city officials have an obligation that should not rest lightly upon their sense of responsibility. Long detours always are irksome, but people are inclined to accept them patiently as long as they are absolutely necessary but it is up to the city officials, particularly the mayor, councilmen and city engineer to see that this patience is not overtaxed by unnecessary delays in the construction work. The period during which traffic must be detoured depends entirely upon the length of time required to move the old Deer Creek bridge to its new location on Fowler street. This time should be shortened just as far as limits of labor and available funds will permit. The responsibility for speeding up this removal and replacement work unquestionably depends largely upon the city officials. Contractors, as a rule, show little inclination to hurry or speed up their work, and particularly is this apt to be the case when they have no interest in city affairs other than the collection of money due them for their labors. The people of Roseburg, whose necessity demands that they travel the detour provided, as well as the visitors passing over the highway and concerns dependent upon motor transportation, have a right to expect that the bridge work be pressed forward with all possible speed consistent with efficiency. Another responsibility in this connection devolves on city and county alike and that is in maintaining the detour in good condition. A city's reputation can be quickly damaged when traffic through it is forced over a poorly kept or dangerous road. The present road with its narrow, one-way bridge needs constant attention in order to be kept in shape for carrying the heavy volume of travel that daily passes over it, so that no effort should be spared to keep it well surfaced and every possible hazard eliminated.

WORK IS STARTING ON EMERGENCY AIR FIELD AT GLENDALE

Construction of the emergency landing field near Glendale has been commenced by the U. S. department of commerce, according to C. D. Garrett, who was in Roseburg today from his ranch near Glendale. The government has leased a piece of land 200 by 2,600 feet from Mr. Garrett and the Selber brothers and is having the field leveled and leveling the tract for grading and maintenance. The field is leased for five years and is not to be used for any other purpose. It is to be strictly an emergency field to supply a safe place for planes on the Pacific coast airway to make a safe landing in the case of necessity. It is planned by the government to have emergency landing every thirty miles in open country and every 15 miles in mountainous regions. In the northern part of the state fields at very frequent intervals are necessary because of the rough nature of the ground and the weather conditions that make flying difficult at certain times of the year.

EXPECT TO OPEN FOWLER ST. BRIDGE ABOUT DEC. 15TH

It will probably be December 15 before the Fowler street bridge can be opened, according to Contractor Samuels, who is in personal charge of the work now in progress. The task of moving the steel spans from their present location to the new piers at the Fowler street site will probably be commenced next week, he states. The piers have already been removed and the sidewalk torn out on one side. The actual moving of the spans will require only two or three days, it is expected, but it is in place the bridge must be cleaned, repainted and painted. New decking must then be placed, sidewalks constructed and the bridge put in shape for travel. It is not to be the collapse of the south pier the work could probably have been done by the first of the month, Mr. Samuels says, but the accident has made the task much more difficult.

Senator McNary After a Conference Says It Is Hopeless.

FRAME NEW RELIEF

Agreement on Measure Is Still Far Away But Hope Relief Will Be Worked Out.

(Associated Press Special Wire)

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—Senator McNary, republican, Oregon, came from a White House conference today with the statement that he realized that final approval of the McNary-Haugen farm relief bill in its present form was hopeless, but still expressing confidence that a relief measure will be worked out and enacted into law.

It was indicated, however, that an agreement on a bill was still far away. While the senator, who is chairman of the senate agriculture committee, declined to discuss his conference with Mr. Coolidge, it was understood that he took up in an informal way a report on farm relief which is to be made soon by a committee of the United States Chamber of Commerce headed by former Secretary Nagel of the commerce department. This is the report to which the president has referred frequently as likely to throw much light on the agricultural problem and one which may be examined with great care.

Senator McNary, however, terse, the report is made public it will be expressed the opinion that while the McNary-Haugen bill which was introduced by its opponent with being. He said that there were still plans to reintroduce the McNary-Haugen bill.

Regarding the debenture tariff scheme of the national grange which the White House yesterday rejected, Senator McNary declared it said might be explored with some care. It was clearly a subsidy and did not begin to provide the assistance to cooperatives in marketing crops that the McNary-Haugen bill did.
