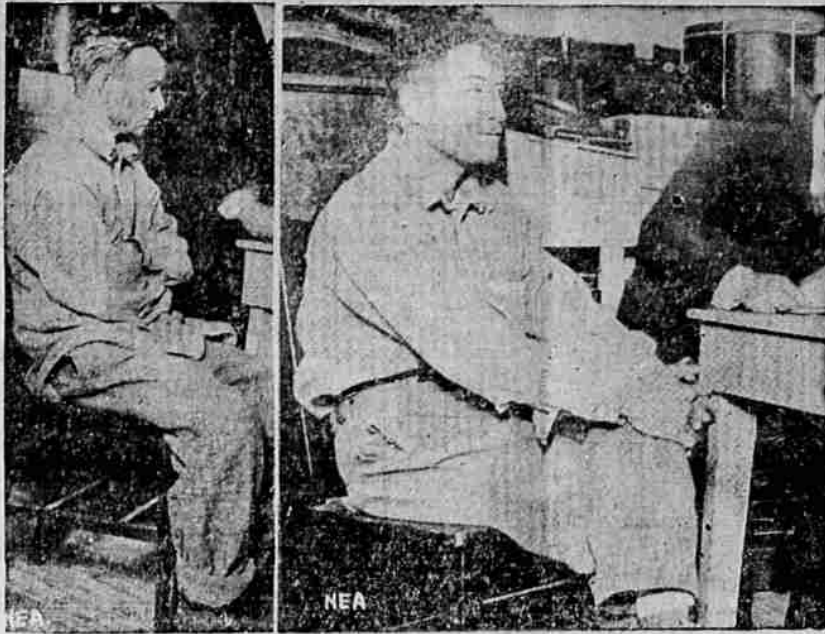

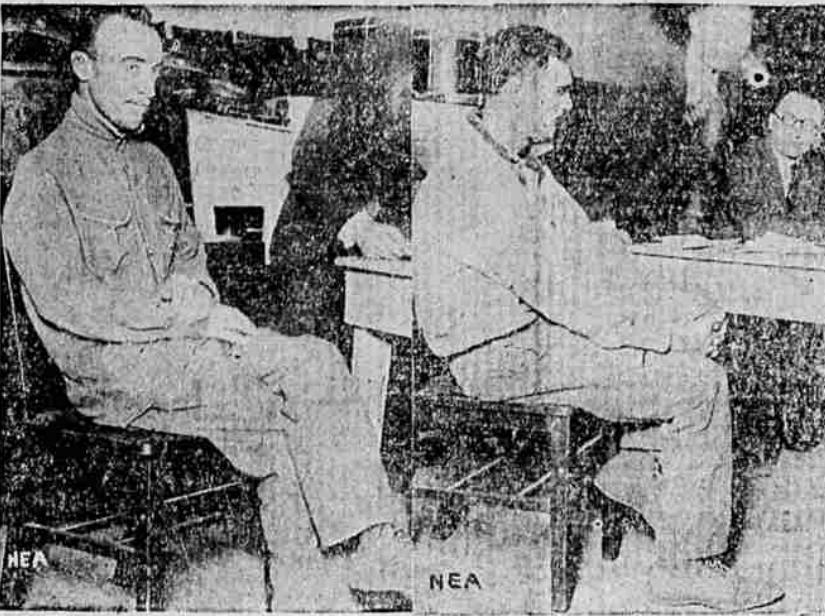

AIRPLANE IS MISSING
(Santa Monica, Calif., Dec. 10.—Watchers on the bay shore north of here reported today they had seen a big airplane fly northward in a thunder, lightning and hail storm at 11 o'clock today. When the storm had cleared and the plane was not in sight, reports circulated that the craft had fallen into the sea.
Police and other boats were sent to the scene about four miles north of here but had reported no trace of a crash more than an hour later.
A passenger carrying airplane which left Los Angeles before 11 o'clock today via the coast line arrived safely on scheduled time at Santa Barbara. No other plane was known to have been in the vicinity and authorities were of the opinion none had fallen.

WOULD SHUT OFF GENERAL DEBATE
(Washington, Dec. 10.—With leaders anxious to shut off general debate on the tax bill before adjournment tonight, the house proceeded under pressure today in discussing provisions of the \$22,735,000 tax reduction measure.
Opening debate, Representative Hawley of Oregon, senior Republican on the house ways and means committee denied a statement made yesterday by Representative Garner of Texas, senior Democrat on the committee, that the treasury department had dictated to Republican committee members how the bill should be framed.

A man giving the name of Frank Smith and a girl who gives the name of Hazel Campbell were arrested last night by Sheriff Webb and deputies at a local rooming house. They are being held on a white slavery charge and a government investigator is expected tomorrow to inquire into the case. The couple are reported to have come from San Francisco by auto. They have admitted that they were not married although posing as man and wife.

PLAN TO SELL BLOCK HITS SNAG
PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 10.—A plan by the federal government to sell a block in the heart of Portland now occupied by the old post office for \$1,750,000 struck a snag today when county officials discovered that the block had been deeded to the city in 1852 for public purposes. The block was sold by the city to the government in 1857 for \$20,000 for erection of the post office. District Attorney Stanley Myers said the government was morally, if not legally bound to re-sell the block back to the city for the purchase price plus reasonable interest if the present building is abandoned. The government's plan contemplated use of the \$1,750,000 to be derived from the sale of the block in buying a new site and erecting a federal office building here. The block was deeded to the city by W. W. Chapman, David H. Lounsdale and Stephen Coffin, who also donated a number of park blocks in the heart of the city.
