SCARFACE AL IS HELD BY POLICE

JOLIET, Ill., Dec. 15.—Al Capone, Chicago gang leader, was arrested today as he alighted from a Santa Fe railroad train at the union station here. The police turned out in force to meet him and he was rushed to headquarters.

Capone had gone to Los Angeles with two friends for a rest, as he explained to police in that city, but found he was an unwelcome guest. Newspaper stories of his arrival in California led the hotel in which he was occupying a luxurious suite, to demand his departure.

Two Los Angeles detectives later accompanied Capone and his party to a train and saw them safely on their way back to Chicago.

Four gangsters, loitering at the union station, were arrested shortly before the train from the west pulled in. Revolvers were taken from them and they were placed in cells to await the arrival of their chief.

The charge placed against Capone was that of carrying concealed weapons.

JESS MILLER UNDER ARREST CHARGED PASSING BAD CHECK

Jess Miller, of this city, was arrested yesterday evening on a charge of passing worthless checks. Checks in denominations of \$5 and \$2.50 were passed on Stump's Grocery and the Monogram cigar store, according to Sheriff Webb, who made the arrest. Miller had no deposit in the bank on which the checks were drawn, according to the officers. He is to be arraigned this afternoon.

DAUGHTER OF BANKER TAKEN BY KIDNAPER

Two Hundred Detectives
Search Today for 12-
Year-Old Girl.

TAKEN FROM SCHOOL

Mysterious Stranger Called
for Her at School Saying
Her Father, Had
Been Injured.

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Dec. 15.—Nearly two hundred detectives, aided by peace officers throughout southern California, were enlisted today in the search for Marion Parker, 12, daughter of Perry M. Parker, bank official, who was kidnapped from the Mount Vernon Junior High school grounds here at noon yesterday.

District Attorney Asa G. Keyes ordered his chief of detectives to place all of his 125 men on the case while 60 detectives were detailed from the police department.

The girl was spirited away from the school grounds by a man believed to be about 20 years old, who told her that her father had been hurt. A school official, hearing the story, permitted the girl to leave with the man in a small coupe. When she did not return home after school her parents called the school authorities and when they learned of the case, notified police.

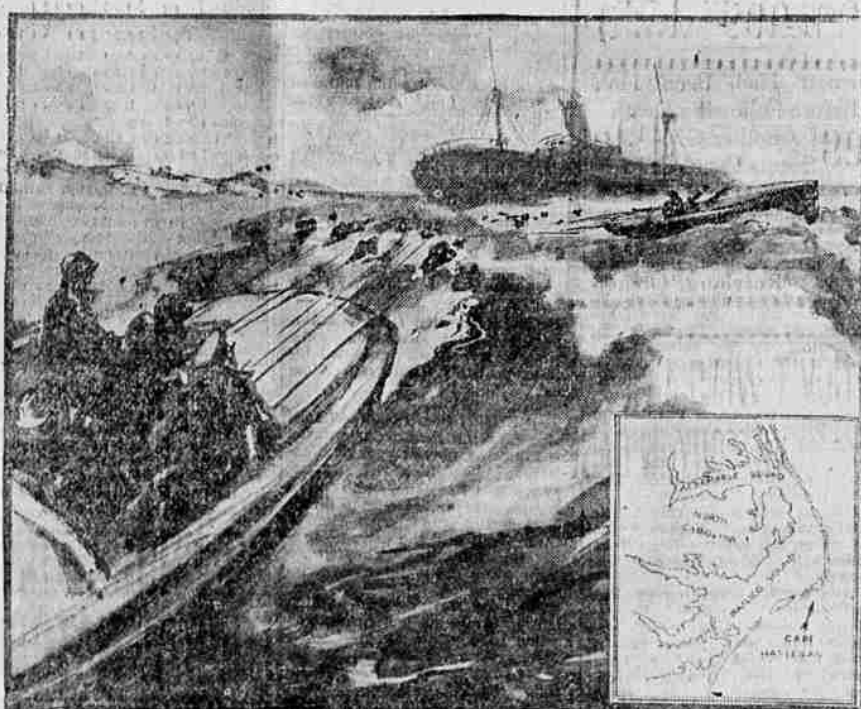
Marjorie Parker, twin sister of Marion, told officers the man had lloitered about the school grounds from early morning until noon. Mrs. Mary Holt, Marion's teacher, said the man came to her and said he had come "for the daughter of P. M. Parker." He told her he was employed in the bank and the girl's father and that the latter had been seriously injured in an accident. Mrs. Holt said he asked for the younger daughter and she permitted Marion to accompany him, because though being, Marion was somewhat smaller than her sister.

Detectives secured the hills back of Sierra Madre, northeast of here, in the belief that the kidnaper might have taken her to a mountain cabin, while other officers questioned every suspicious character and watched railway stations and telephone booths.

Parker is assistant cashier of the Los Angeles First National Trust and Savings Bank.
