STATE TAX LEVY
SHOWS INCREASE
OVER LAST YEAR

More Than Quarter Million Gain Announced by Tax Commission—Values Are Higher.

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 28.—Oregon taxpayers will have to pay a total of \$7,710,194.20 to the state in 1928, according to the levy as promulgated by the state tax commission this afternoon. Of this amount \$2,290,381.85 represents expenses of state institutions and departments financed within the constitutional 6 per cent limit. The remainder of \$5,419,722.35, or two-thirds of the total, is accounted for by special millage taxes, such as those for the state institutions of higher learning, the market road tax, elementary school tax, soldiers' bonus tax and other special levies approved by the voters of the state.

The 1928 tax will be an increase of \$262,512.40 over the tax of 1927, approximately one-half of which is accounted for by the normal 6 per cent increase in the ordinary state tax and the other half by an increase in the millage taxes through increased property valuations.

Of the 36 counties in the state, six will pay less state taxes in 1928 than in 1927. These are Clatsop, Crook, Gilliam, Malheur, Sherman and Wallowa, all of which reported material decreases in property valuations this year. Multnomah county will pay approximately \$100,000 more in state taxes this year than it did last year.

PECULIAR RATS
FOUND BY PROF.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Dec. 28.—White rats that hopped about like kangaroos and perched on their food bowls like birds were described before the American Society of Zoologists today by Professor Harold S. Colton of the University of Pennsylvania.

The animals were deprived of their forelegs under ether shortly after birth in a series of laboratory experiments designed to determine their adaptability to such a drastic change in their structure. From the time they left their mother's nest, Professor Colton related, they showed themselves ready to meet the new conditions as bipeds, one of them being able to hop ten inches from the bottom of a bucket to perch on the rim. When compared with their normal brothers and sisters, it was found that they had become knocked thru the bending of the bones just below the knee joints, that the muscles which spread the toes had become enlarged and that the ankle joint had withered, giving them the stability they needed after the loss of their forelegs.

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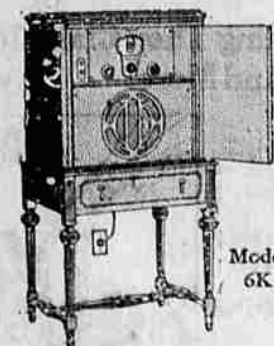

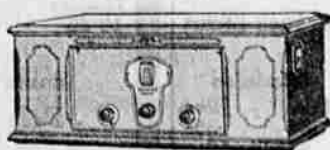
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
