REWARD POSTED FOR RECOVERY OF BODY OF MRS. DENNIS WEBB

COQUILLE, Jan. 12.—Reward of \$100 has been posted by C. W. Myatt, father of Delle Webb, who is believed to have been drowned in Coos Bay, for the finding of the body of Delle Webb. It was announced in a telegram received by the sheriff's office here from Mr. Myatt, who is now in Abilene, Texas, former home of the girl.

The wife is believed to have drowned on the night of November 28, 1927, when the coupe driven by Dennis Webb went off the Virginia avenue dock in North Bend, the coupe and the body of Webb being later discovered.

This is the first reward offered that has been posted.

The body of Dennis Webb will be shipped in two days to his home in La Grange, Tex., by the Peterson Funeral home in North Bend. It is not yet known whether anyone will accompany the body to Texas.
