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JACK'S SILENCE SEEMS IRKSOME; HAND IS STRONG

NEW YORK, Jan. 12—An air of patient silence hung heavily today about Jack Sharkey, whose New Year resolution of "no more blood and thunder" outbursts excluded even a prediction as to what dire happenings would be visited upon Tom Heeney in the Madison Square Garden ring tomorrow night.

But through the veil of reticence that has fallen so suddenly over the massive form, there came occasional flashes of the old Sharkey, the cocky youth who gave the "eye" to ancient Mike McTigue and Jimmy Malone, and even tried to stare out of countenance Jack Dempsey, the old Massena Mauler himself, before falling before the former champion's mule-like body ramming in the Yankee Stadium last summer.

"Why should I spend thousands of dollars training for a little guy like Heeney if I intended to run out a few days before the fight," Sharkey demanded, pounding on the edge of a chair the left hand fractured in training for the original match with Heeney, postponed from late in 1926.

"I should give up sixty grand for fighting him? Oh, no; no, no." All questions about Sharkey's general condition and the present state of the injury—an incomplete fracture of a bone just back of the little finger—were answered vehemently by Johnny Buckley, manager of the former goliath.

"Jack is in splendid shape, weighs just 193 pounds," they chorused. "His left hand is as strong as ever. Any mystery as to his condition and ability to hit with that duke will be cleared up in the ring Friday night. Jack will win by a knockout in five rounds or so."

Then Jack offered to hit anybody in the place with the left just to show that it was in perfect working order. After a deep silence all present agreed that Sharkey's hand was faultless and there was no demonstration.

Sharkey has no agreement with Rickard for any fight to follow the Heeney match, Buckley declared, and there will be no talk of a fight with Tunney until the obstacle just ahead has been cleared.

The Boston youngster, who fought his way in bolsterous fashion past George Godfrey, Harry Wills, McTigue and Delaney before Dempsey stopped him short of a title match, declared that over-training cost him the victory over the former heavyweight king. "I came back to New York to train for that fight with only two days' rest in Boston and a short

trip to the woods before starting the grind for Dempsey in the stifling heat of the Madison Square Garden gymnasium," he said. "That's what lamed me before the bout ever started."
