YEW WOOD TAKEN OUT UMPQUA FOREST

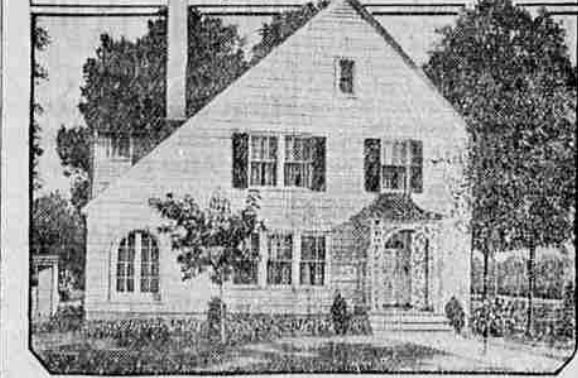
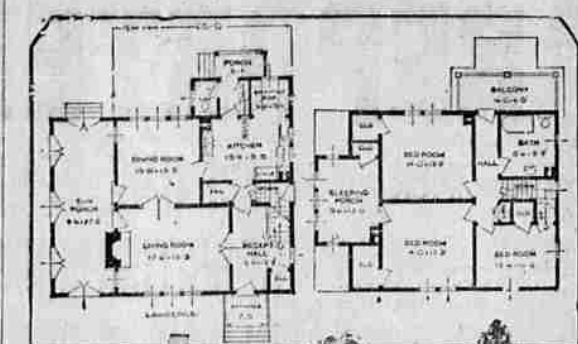
