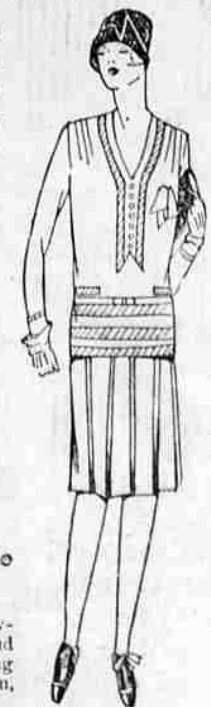

Undoubtedly many manufacturers meeting a local or restricted demand, may best remain for the present in their accustomed territory—but Oregon has its own before it can hope to attract trade as vast in proportion as its unspent resource of power and material. Just over the way lies the Orient with its waking appetite for such goods as Oregon may make and Portland ships may cheaply deliver. When men realize the industrial advantages this state has to offer—and think of the western horizon as an invitation rather than a barrier—industries will come to Oregon—and people, too.—Portland Telegram.
