LA GRANDE, Ore., Mar. 14.—Senators Fred E. Kildee, manager of the Herbert Hoover presidential campaign in Oregon, received word this morning from Washington that the situation in Ohio is very encouraging with indications that Hoover will win a majority of the delegates from Senator Willis.

Kildee believes that the Republican sentiment in Oregon is overwhelmingly in favor of the secretary of commerce and says that so far it appears as if there will be no opposition to Hoover in the primary election.

Kildee will leave for his Portland headquarters this evening. He has just recently completed a visit to southern Oregon, stopping at Ashland, Grants, Medford, Roseburg and Cottage Grove.

Paper Boundaries Don't Worry Ibn Saud.

Britain's Trans-Jordania foe campaigns in Motor Cars in Desert Region.

MECCA, Arabia, Mar. 14.—Invading the territory of his neighbors is one of the favorite pastimes of Ibn Saud, king of Hedjaz, sultan of Nejd and husband of 24 wives, whose latest warlike ally against the British in the British mandates of Iraq and Trans-Jordan is being watched with concern by Great Britain.

Ibn Saud is a sort of super-sheikh, who pays little attention to the paper boundaries which international treaties have fixed for him and his Wahabi tribesmen. This pleasure-loving son of the desert, clad in turban and flowing robes, has spent most of his 48 years in building up a force in the heart of Arabia which has been resisting the encroachment of a neighboring tribe.

The fact that Iraq and Trans-Jordan, which lie to the north of his kingdom, are foreign mandates makes no difference to the Arab chieftain who has wrested Mecca from rivals and has established himself as king of the Arabian desert.

Ibn Saud's court is now largely on wheels. Fast motor cars make it possible for him to move his large family with great speed. And when Ibn Saud extends his ravages to territories entrusted to Great Britain he is pitting cavalry against forces equipped with all sorts of modern aircraft and artillery.

Days of the dashing warfare of Arab horsemen, who could retire safely into the desert after their bold raids, are over. Birdmen now pursue the Wahabis into their retreats, and mechanical aviation in such a manner that the Arab has no force: impossible for motorized armies.

Fingerprints and photographs of Waynick have been forwarded to the army corps headquarters at San Francisco in the hope that they will aid that bureau in furnishing further information concerning the veteran's relatives.
