Early Planting of Spring Annuals to Brighten Yards Is Urged

Roseburg Garden Club is endeavoring to secure the beautification of yards throughout the city before the coming conventions—tells of early-blooming flowers that may be planted now.

"We are all interested to a certain extent in the conventions that are coming to our city during the summer, and, of course, want our city to appear at its best." Mrs. Fred Chapman told the members of the Roseburg Garden Club at its meeting Monday night in discussing the flowers that enter into the city garden.

"We all raise flowers," Mrs. Chapman said, "but most of the blossoms come during the late summer. As we are having early conventions, the only way we have of getting a show of color in our yards is from the early, quickly-growing annuals. Most of the plants in the following list may be planted within the next few weeks in the places in which they are to flower."

"Sweet Alyssum—blossoms within six weeks of sowing. May be sown now. Sow every month for a succession of bloom.

"Arenaria or blue-eyed African daisy—a very beautiful white or light blue annual with great green foliage. Lasts for a week in water. Very easily grown.

"Annual candy-tuft—Must be sown several times to have a longer blooming period. Centaurea or Sweet Sultan—Very beautiful and the newer varieties are very lovely. The variety called basket flower is the giant of the family.

"Sunshine Aster—A single variety in various colors. They are perfect cut flowers, lasting for over a week in water. The centers vary in each flower; some are quilled, others plain and some have twisted curved petals.

"Clarkias are very quickly and easily grown and newer double varieties are especially fine. If the blossoms are cut just before the flowers open they make a fine cut flower.

"African Orange Daisy—The new hybrids are very fine. They are rather dwarf and blossom over a long period of time. Godetia—Likes poor soil. Will go to leaf instead of flower in rich soil.

"Gypsophila—In the annual form is very good. Comes in white and pink. Annual Larkspur—Especially the pink variety is good for early planting.

"Phacelia campanularia—Gentian blue flower with white throat. Fine for border plant. Very dwarf. Virginian Stock—Sow early and be sure to thin plants or they will be spindly.

"Saponaria—Like annual baby-breath. Fine for mixer in bouquets. Rose and white varieties. Viscaria—Comes in rosy pink and bright blue. Will bloom all summer. Dwarf.

"The Garden Club is endeavoring to interest home owners in sowing annuals. Immediately upon the planting of the plants, they will bloom when the late spring and early summer conventions come on. Visitors can be greatly impressed by the beauty of the city if the cooperation of all home owners is secured in this important feature of beautification.

Farrell's sensational 65 yesterday parred eight strokes from La Gorce par and was acquired by means of six birdies and an eagle with never a flight over regulation figures. Farrell found the tiny Scot matching him shot for shot on the outward nine of the afternoon.

SINCLAIR'S PONIES BARRED FROM TRACK

(Associated Press Leased Wire) NEW YORK, Mar. 21.—The debarring of Harry F. Sinclair's horses from Maryland tracks created a stir in turf circles today. The action of the Maryland racing commission, taken because of Teapot Dome scandal, is the first instance in many years wherein a large owner has been prohibited from racing his stock. It is one of the few times, if any, that an outstanding operator on the thoroughbred tracks of America has been the subject of such action for reasons outside racing itself.

In communications to the officials of the four racing tracks of Maryland—Pimlico, Bowie, Havre de Grace and Laurel—the Maryland commission said: "The view of the widespread adverse criticism that has resulted from pending court proceedings and the investigation of the United States senate committee regarding the action of Mr. Harry F. Sinclair, the commission deems it advisable for your association not to permit the starting of any horse owned by, or to be run under the name of Mr. Sinclair or the Ranocous stable, at your coming race meetings until further action of this commission."

Interest is now directed as to whether the New York and Kentucky racing bodies will take official cognizance of the procedure of the Maryland commission. Sinclair maintains one of the biggest stables in the country with an investment of more than \$2,500,000 in his horses and breeding farm at Jeddah, N. Y. He has more than sixty horses in training, forty of which are two year olds.

ESSEX LEADS IN NATION WIDE REGISTRATIONS

According to a report in a recent issue of the Automobile Daily Daily News, Essex registrations for 35 states of the Union for January lead all other makes of cars save one by 153. This report credits Essex with 6741 cars during the month, and the nearest figure to that number are 6528. The one car credited with more registrations is a four.
