MODEL AIRPLANES ARE EXHIBITED BY YOUNG MAKERS

An exceptionally fine display of model airplanes was made today at the C. A. Lockwood company garage. The model plane contest was sponsored by Umpqua Post of the American Legion, prizes being offered for contestants from three divisions, grade schools, junior high school and the senior high school.

Those who have seen the displays are amazed by the workmanship demonstrated by some of the exhibitors. Each of the models is a replica of some standard type of plane, Lindbergh's "Spirit of St. Louis," of course, predominating.

One exhibitor has copied the big tri-motored passenger planes now in use on the coast lines, and has a ship that demonstrates the highest type of careful workmanship. All of the models submitted are of the monoplane type, although several different makes are represented.

GENERAL OREGON HAS MORAL CREED

CHICAGO CITY, Mar. 27.—War upon alcohol, gambling and race-woman has been declared by General Alvato Oregon, sole candidate for the presidency.

In a campaign speech at Silao, Guanajuato, yesterday, he denounced these as enemies of the Mexican people.

"Reaction is our principal enemy, alcohol is its most formidable ally, cards the ally of all the enemies of morality," he said.

General Oregon also denounced what he termed "wicked Catholics." He said they were those who used their religion as a means of propagating anti-government activities.

"It may be necessary to spill a little more blood . . . in order to eliminate the last small nuclei of these evil ones, those false Catholics who would make of their religion a banner for fratricidal strife."

GENERAL SANDINO STILL ELUSIVE

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, Mar. 27.—With the rainy season a little more than a month off, making jungle fighting difficult, the belief is growing among the American marines that General Augustino Sandino, rebel leader, can elude them indefinitely.

The only hope that they see of eliminating Sandino is that he be dropped from an airplane might while on his camp. This possibility is admittedly slim, because of Sandino's frequent movements and the efforts made to conceal his headquarters.

PIERCE TO FAVOR WALSH FOR PRES.

LA GRANDE, Ore., Mar. 27.—Former Governor Walter M. Pierce, speaking before the Union county Pomona Grange, declared emphatically that he is "first, last and all the time for Senator Walsh's candidacy for president, and I shall certainly cast my vote for him if I have an opportunity to do so at the primaries."

This was in the nature of a reply to a letter written by Oswald West, Democratic national committeeman for Oregon, which questioned Pierce as to the truth of rumors that Al Smith's candidacy was fading favor in the eyes of the former governor.

BUSINESS IS ON UPGRADE IN U. S.

NEW YORK, Mar. 27.—The New York World which has made a survey of business conditions epitomizes the results today as follows:

"Business in the United States is on the upgrade, with unemployment on the decrease."

"More than that, business birds fair to escape much of the halting uncertainty that usually has characterized presidential election years."

"To this survey leaders in industry, labor leaders, bankers and national distributors have contributed as have the leading statistical services. Much also has come from government agencies."

"The survey does not show that business is improving in all lines—mining and textiles, where

where special conditions govern, being outstanding exceptions—but generally speaking the reports show improved prospects reported in the great majority of lines."

"The outstanding factors are improvement in the building, steel and automobile industries."

"Improvement is also noted in agriculture, especially in the stock raising branch, which is declared to have emerged from the severe depression that marked the collapse of the post-war boom."

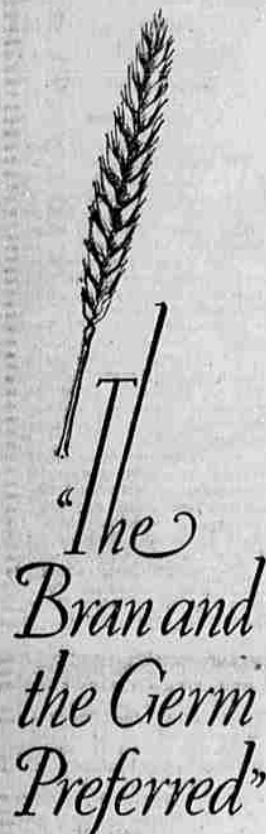
