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BEACONS VISIBLE 150 MILES GUIDE TO NIGHT FLIERS

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., April 6.—From the crest of Mount Diablo near Oakland, more land and sea is visible than from any other spot on the North American continent.

On this eminence and on one of the Merced hills near Los Angeles, incandescent electric beacons are being reared above two 75-foot towers to aid night-time aviation.

The beacons will develop ten million candlepower, and will have a visibility of 100 to 150 miles. They will be illuminated sometime in April.

As Mount Diablo rises from level country, the placing of a light upon it is virtually equivalent to placing a beacon on a tower 4,000 feet high, or four times as high as the Paris Eiffel tower. The need for height is to surmount fog which sometimes curtains the aviator's view of the ground up to an altitude of about 2,000 feet.

The reflector and lens of the beacons are 36 inches in diameter. In front of the reflector is a 1,500-watt incandescent lamp. If it burns out a second lamp is thrown over automatically to take its place.

An astronomical clock turns the beacons on at sunset and off at dawn, compensating automatically for the constantly changing time of sunset and sunrise.

The Standard Oil company is installing the two beacons at the suggestion of the department of commerce, complementing the existing system of day-time airway signs and of beacons which are being built or which are projected by the department of commerce.

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MARATHONERS ON THIRTY-THIRD LAP IN RAIN AND SNOW

AMARILLO, Texas, April 6.—Accepting the added handicap of adverse weather, the 90 runners and walkers remaining in the trans-continental marathon today turned toward Groom, 42 miles east of here.

The thirty-third lap of 37 miles from Vega yesterday was one of the most exacting since the start at Los Angeles March 4. As they lined up at Vega a flurry of snow offered variety from the clouds of rain and sleet that had engulfed the caravan. Rain followed the snow, continuing at intervals throughout the trek.

Pat Demarr of Los Angeles was the first to arrive here. His mark of 5:29:42 gave him an elapsed time of 297:244 for the 1,193 miles. John Sato, Pasadena, N. J., was second in 6:05:07. Andrew Payne, Claremore, Oklahoma, Phillip Granville, Hamilton, Ontario, and Arne Suominen of Detroit, finished less than 20 minutes behind Sato. Suominen continued to lead in elapsed time with 196:07:43.

Allan Currier, Grants Pass, Ore., finished twentieth in 8:26:31 and 252:00:16 elapsed time.

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WORK STARTED ON AIR FIELD NEAR GLENDALE

Glenade, not to be out done by the other portions of the state, will have an emergency landing field right at her very doors, says the Glendale Log.

A contract was let to Frank Hill recently for leveling off the field and putting it in shape for service. The place will be entirely sowed to blue grass.

Further contract was let to C. O. Garrett and son to build a fence around the enclosure. The fence will consist of 48-inch wire netting with two lines of barbed wire above the netting.

The field is located about a mile and a half from the city near the highway and ground formerly part of the C. O. Garrett and son and Sether ranches. When completed the field will measure 300x1800 feet. Over \$2000 will be expended immediately upon the grounds.
