MEETING TODAY
AT MYRTLE CREEK

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a hero's farewell today to Floyd Bennett as his body started toward its resting place in the national cemetery of the United States.

Circling airplanes, dipping in salute above the cortege, honored the man whose exploits had brought the science of flying fresh laurels, while slowly through the tortuous streets of the ancient city rumbled the gun carriage bearing the body.

The royal 22nd regiment was his escort and his tribute came with the tears of the men, women and children who with bowed heads quietly took places in the ever-lengthening procession as it moved toward a waiting train.

A small group had assembled in the chapel of the Jeffrey Hale hospital where the aviator who had conquered the frozen north in the first flight to the pole, died yesterday.

Notables Attend Rites
There the Very Reverend Archbishop Scott conducted the simple service of the Anglican church. The widow and his beloved chief, Commander Richard E. Byrd, who were with him when he died, the American consul and vice-consul at Quebec and their wives, and provincial and municipal officials were among the privileged few who stood about the body of the flier who had been stricken while bringing relief to fellow aviators.

The cortege slowly moved away, winding through the streets. Commander Byrd with officers of the regiment and of the military area followed on foot. Mrs. Bennett and Consul and Mrs. E. H. Donnellson entered a closed carriage for the sad journey.

Many in Tears
Following the military, the throngs who had gathered at the hospital and along the way, fell in line. Many were unable to restrain their tears.

At the station where the body was placed in the special car to bear it to New York and thence to Washington, a salute crashed from rifles of the firing squad. This salute of a salute greeted over the throng and Quebec paid its homage and loosed its grief.

HERE CONDUCT
SHORT REVIVAL

World Famous Evangelist
to Aid Local Church in
Campaign.

DEDICATE BUILDING

Will Be Talented Singer—
Other Members of Party
Are Specialists in
Religious Work.

"America must furnish the boys and the bullion, the girls and the gold, the men and the money and the funds and the forces to prevent the world from taking the path of tragedy across the unexplored sea of the future," said Dr. Charles Reign Scoville, world-famous evangelist of Chicago, who arrived in Roseburg today from Columbus, Ohio, where he has been attending the international convention of the Church of Christ.

Dr. Scoville is without doubt the greatest evangelist ever raised up by the Christian church, and is one of the five greatest soul winners of all time. During his evangelistic career extending over a period of twenty-five years he has encircled the globe, crossed five oceans, received 150,000 persons into the church and has the unique distinction of seeing more persons baptized than any living man. His campaigns have revolutionized some of the largest cities in the country including New York City, Chicago, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Des Moines, Billings, Ft. Worth, Dallas, Shreveport, Sacramento, etc. In 1912 in a world tour he held great meetings in Perth, Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide Australia, winning 3,000 converts under the Southern Cross.

Associated with Dr. Scoville in the Roseburg meetings are Mrs. Arlene Dux Scoville, charming and talented wife of the evangelist, Rev. James R. Axtell, Mr. Isaac N. Farris and Miss Irene Scoville. Mrs. Scoville is acclaimed by the thousands who have heard her as the sweetest singer in the evangelistic field today. After her graduation from the Chicago high school she began her musical career under Professor Phelps, under whom she studied for two years, after which she entered Columbia College, Columbia, Missouri. Later Mrs. Scoville studied under John Dennis Mehan of Carnegie Hall, New York City, and for the past fourteen seasons she has been a student of the famous Oscar Sanger, declared to be the greatest voice teacher of his age. Mrs. Scoville recently made her debut into grand opera.

To night's Service
"The Call of God," will in all probability be the subject of Dr. Scoville's first sermon in the new Christian church building tonight. In this remarkable address the evangelist will show the height and depth, the breadth and the length of God's invitation to the human race. Mrs. Scoville will sing one of her choice solos. One of the remarkable accomplishments of this gifted soprano is that she never refers to a manuscript in singing one of her 225 vocal solos.

World-famous as a preacher the coming of Dr. Scoville to Roseburg is of more than usual interest. Dr. Scoville was born on a farm near Butler, and passed through the public schools there. He was later graduated from Tri-State College, Angola, Indiana, with a Bachelor of Science degree. He then taught in the public schools and in normal for a time, and preached in various churches each week, and even in those early days his success as a soul-winner was noticeable. He entered Hiram College and took in five years a seven-year course, graduating with his A. B. and A. M. degrees. He also has a doctor's degree (D. D.) from Drake University, Des Moines, Iowa. After his graduation, Dr. Scoville spent four years in evangelistic work. Later he went to Chicago, where he organized the Metropolitan Church of Christ with 107 members. The membership quickly increased to 600 under Dr. Scoville's soul-stirring sermons. Dr. Scoville left the pastorate of this church to take up evangelistic work again, and since that time he has preached the gospel around the world. He is a Mason, Knight Templar, Scottish Rite and Shrine degree; an Odd Fellow and a member of the Knights of Pythias, also of the United Commercial Travelers.

DRESS CODE IS
ADOPTED BY JR. HI

At a mass meeting of the Junior high school girls Tuesday it was voted to accept the dress code suggested by the Helix club, a group of 30 ninth grade girls. The code, in part, is as follows:

"We the girls of Roseburg Junior high desire to carry out ideals of simplicity, modesty in good taste in our dress; therefore we suggest the following as appropriate for school wear:

"1. Cotton, wool or wash silk dresses, made in sports or tailored styles, middie or sweaters and skirts. Silvery dresses are not good taste.

"3. Inexpensive and acceptable hose. Chiffon hose barred.

"4. Excessive use of cosmetics is very poor taste."
