NO OPPOSITION TO HOOVER OR SMITH IN NEW JERSEY

TRENTON, N. J., April 29.—Herbert Hoover, secretary of commerce, is the only entrant in New Jersey's presidential preference primary on May 15.

On the Democratic side, Governor Alfred E. Smith, while not officially seeking endorsement, has the support of many delegate candidates.

While little excitement prevails over the selection of delegates to the political conventions, a four-sided contest for the Republican nomination for governor and a five-sided contest for the Republican nomination for United States senator has stirred the state. The senatorial quest is for the seat now held by Senator Edwards.

Not since 1916, when gubernatorial and presidential elections coincided, has New Jersey elected a Republican governor. Among the senatorial candidates are Joseph Frelinghuysen, former senator, and Hamilton F. Kean, former national committeeman. Senator Edge has given his support to Edward C. Stokes, former governor. One woman, Mrs. Lillian S. Feickert, is in the race on a dry platform. All others favor a referendum for modification of the prohibition law. There are no contests for Democratic nominations for senator or governor.

PARENTS CONTROL HEALTH OF CHILD

NEW YORK CITY, April 30.—That the best development that can come out of the celebration of National Child Health Day on May 1 will be the education of parents, was the belief expressed today by four experts in child welfare work.

Says Dr. Louise Stanley, Chief of Bureau of Home Economics of the U. S. Department of Agriculture: "The mother has it in her power so to feed her child as to

prevent poor chest development, beaded ribs, bad teeth, bowed legs, rough hair and susceptibility to infection. A balanced diet would include: at least a pint of milk a day; meat or egg once a day for protein; a dark cereal either as a mush or whole wheat bread at two meals a day for vitamin and mineral content; potato or brown rice once a day and one other cooked vegetable; a citrus fruit, tomato juice, or raw green vegetable once a day; and butter at every meal."

Says Anna E. Richardson, field worker in Child Development and Parental Education with the American Home Economics Association: "There is a very simple and fundamental law of learning which should be the guide for all fathers and mothers. It is this: 'We learn by doing.' Do I wish my child to have respect for property in the home and elsewhere? I must give him a chance to feel ownership, to have the joy of keeping his things in order, in a place set apart for his very own. Do I wish him to be self-reliant? Then I must never do anything for him that he can do for himself. Do I wish him to be unselfish? Then I must give him a chance to share his belongings. If he is to feel family loyalty, then I must let him share in planning family activities."

Says Edna Noble White, director of the Merrill-Palmer school: "In an environment especially fitted to his needs the child learns through participation in life activities. He must be trained in those complex matters that are education for the young child—the control of the body, sense and speech development, appreciation of music, color, and nature, and the formation of good physical habits. He must be taught to concentrate upon his tasks and to be self-reliant."

Says Dr. Douglas A. Thom of the Boston Psychopathic hospital: "The personality of the child is in the process of development from the day of birth—perhaps before. It is up to the parents to direct the forces of personality in such ways that they will be emotionally satisfactory to the child and compatible with the demands of the environment in which he has to live."

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SOUTH CHINA TROOPS OCCUPY ANOTHER TOWN

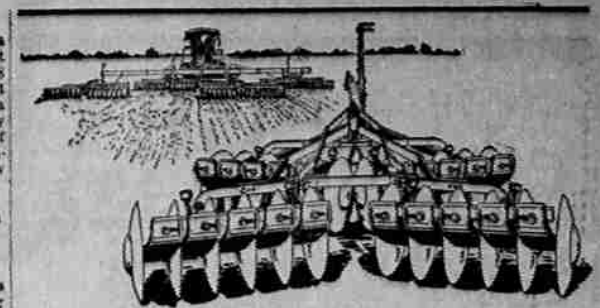
