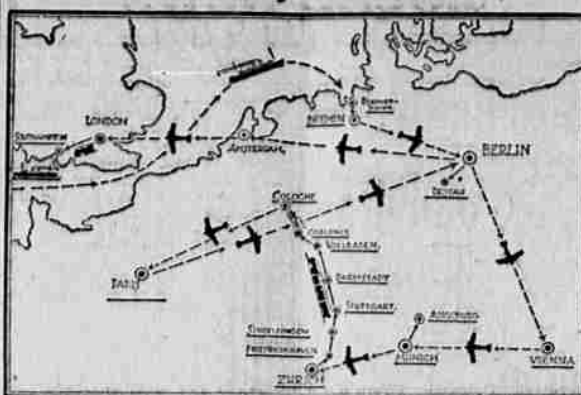

Now—A Foreign Air Tour Personally Conducted

New York, May 23.—The personally conducted air tour of Europe has arrived. At least the North German Lloyd steamship line has advertised for patrons for the first one. It's scheduled for September 8-October 9, the dates of departure from and return to New York.

The tourists will sail from New York aboard the liner Columbus. They'll land at Bremerhaven, and then take to the air for visits to Berlin, Vienna, Munich, Zurich, Cologne, Paris, Amsterdam, London and way points. All the European travel will be by airplane except from Zurich to Cologne. At Berlin the tourists will see the International Aeronautical Exhibition.

While the journeys between airports will be made at high speed, the manner of conveyance will afford the fullest opportunities for sightseeing. Luxurious German, Dutch, French, and English planes will be used. There will be leisurely stops en route.

As a final touch of modernism, planes will be used to bring patrons from their home towns to New York to set sail aboard the Columbus.

Cost of the tour will be from \$1200 up. It's announced, with a special rate of \$840 for students of aviation. The tourists will travel a total of 9553 miles. Each passenger will receive an embossed certificate relating the history of the trip.

DETROIT, Mich., June 7.—The six men who yesterday held up the Detroit News in a daring daylight robbery obtained approximately \$14,800 the paper announced today. The loot represented less than half the payroll of the paper, a part of which the bandits failed to dis-
