NEARLY ONE-HALF OF COUNTY TAXES GOES TO SCHOOL

Over 45 Per Cent of All Money Raised Taxation Goes Institutions of Learning.

Almost one-half of the money raised by taxation in Douglas county goes to the support of the schools of the county and state according to figures compiled by County Clerk I. B. Riddle. For roads the county spends about one-fourth of its tax money, while the expense of county government requires only one-tenth.

The colleges and universities of the state take 7.2 per cent of the total money raised from taxation, while high schools and elementary schools require 28.4 per cent, making a total of 45.6 per cent for school purposes. In money the high and elementary schools re-

ceive \$451,236 while the schools of higher education receive \$85,252 from the money raised by the county from taxation. For roads the county pays 26.6 per cent of its tax income, or \$313,648.

In conducting the county government 10.1 per cent is used, or \$120,337. This money goes for salaries, expenses, an emergency fund of \$10,000, a bridge fund of \$22,000, a sum of \$2,500 for rights of ways, \$3,000 for bounties and \$1,500 for aid to small school districts, all of these latter sums being included in the \$120,337 listed as the county general fund.

MELBOURNE, Australia, June 13.—The trans-Atlantic monoplane Columbia would not take off today on the continuation of its trans-Atlantic flight with Miss Mabel Boll and her companions, Capt. Oliver LeBoutilliere, chief pilot and Arthur Argles, co-pilot.

PICTURES G. O. P. MEET DEVELOPED IN AN AIRPLANE

NEW YORK, June 13.—For the first time in news reel history, a flying laboratory was used when moving picture film and newspaper photographs of the opening of the republican convention yesterday were developed and printed while being flown east from Kansas City.

Stubs were made by this Richfield-Paramount-Associated Press flying laboratory to permit the distribution of prints along the line of flight.

The plane, piloted by Bud Gurney, St. Louis air mail pilot, carried all the intricate laboratory equipment necessary for developing, printing, cutting, selecting and titling moving picture film as well as a compact dark room capable of turning out a large number of still photographs. Besides the pilot, the plane carried a staff of three men.

While the big plane raced across the continent, the laboratory staff worked continuously. Hundreds of feet of film and still photographs made by several cameramen had to be developed and prepared for delivery to the theatres and Associated Press newspapers.

COMPETITION OF CANADIAN GRAIN GROWERS IS FELT

(Associated Press Leased Wire) SEATTLE, June 13.—Canadian competition in grain growing has become a "dangerous factor" in the agrarian development of Washington, J. Carl Lancy, state secretary of the farm bureau, testified today at the Interstate commerce

commission grain rate hearing. Supported by voluminous exhibits Lancy gave a comprehensive comparison of farming conditions between the grain districts of western Canada and eastern Washington. He asserted that aid given farmers by Canadian railroads and the government was attracting growers from Washington to Canada.

With cheap land, low taxes, low grain rates and fertilizer, Alberta ranchers cannot only raise at a cost of several dollars an acre lower than those of Washington can, Lancy testified, but they can reach both their eastern and western markets at a much lower cost.
