### SATURDAY WILL BE THE LONGEST DAY OF THE YEAR

While June 21 is commonly ac-  
cepted as the longest day of the  
year, such is not the case in Rose-  
burg this year, according to C. A.  
Cole, meteorologist, temporarily in  
charge of the local Weather Bu-  
reau station. People generally be-  
lieve the longest day to be on the  
21st, Mr. Cole says, marking the  
division of spring and summer, but  
this does not hold true for all lat-  
itudes.  
At latitude 43° 13' which is the  
imaginary line which runs through  
Roseburg, the longest day occurs  
on June 23rd. On that day the sun  
is at 4:21 a. m. and sets at 7:43  
p. m., while on June 21 it rises at  
the same time but sets one minute  
earlier. From June 20 to 26, in-  
clusive, the days are within a few  
seconds of being of equal length,  
the 23rd only having the distinc-  
tion of being one minute longer  
than the others.
