## JUGOSLAV LEADER SHOT AND KILLED

(Associated Press Leased Wire)  
VIENNA, June 20.—Dispatches from Belgrade report that Musissa Ratchitch shot and killed Paul Raditch, nephew of Stefan Raditch, the peasant leader, in the Skupstchina this morning.

At the same time the slayer, described as a government supporter, wounded two other members of parliament. He was handed over to the police.

Telegraph communication between Belgrade and abroad has been interrupted.

Paul Raditch, who has played a somewhat subsidiary role to that of his uncle, Stefan Raditch, in Jugoslavian politics, is a former minister of agrarian reforms, having served in that capacity in the Ouzounitch cabinet of 1924.
