EDUCATORS GIVE THEIR FORMULAS FOR ENDING WAR The social scientist, probing into the motives and effects of war, disinterestedly, can apply its findings to the promotion of peace. Dr. Hall said. "He can show that war is futile. One nation cannot destroy the resources of another without destroying its trade. War is barbarous. Only the uncivilized still believe that righteousness can be obtained by the sword. War blazes national hatreds. Only a broad intelligent patriotism can bring peace. War breaks down respect for law. It weakens the law to the winds, breeding a cynicism for all law in peace times," the speaker remarked. Bishop Lee declared scientific formula useless "unless they are vitalized by the dynamic force of the human heart through which works the spirit of God."
