## SPANISH PLANE ON 'ROUND GLOBE TRIP'

CADEZ, Spain, Aug. 1.—Four Spanish airmen hopped off this morning in a four motored seaplane, named the Numanca, on the first lap of a flight around the world in forty-five days.

Before leaving, Ramon Franco, pilot and commander, informed the Associated Press correspondent that he hoped to be back in Cadiz in 45 days. Captain Luis de Alda, who was with Franco in the first flight across the south Atlantic in 1926, was navigator aboard the plane. The other members of the crew were Emilio Galaz, co-pilot, and Pablo Rada, mechanic.

The plane will be navigated by directional wireless.

## CROPS IN OREGON AFFECTED BY HEAT

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 1.—Intense heat caused rapid ripening of spring and winter grain, and

resulted in some damage. It also caused some delay of harvest. This is reported in the weather bureau's weekly crop report. Some local damage was done by hail, and several large tracts of wheat were burned.

Fruit crops are ripening rapidly. Intense heat caused some scald on apples and pears and ripened apricots so rapidly as to unfit them for shipping in places. Early peaches and apples are becoming more plentiful.

Cows are falling in milk due to short pasturage. Some work horses were killed by heat in western counties. Turkeys are doing well.

**ANDRIE TRADES FOR T. J. WILLIAMS PLACE**  
An important real estate deal was completed today when Henry Andrie purchased the T. J. Williams ranch at Ten Mile. The deal was in the nature of a trade. Mr. Williams taking the Henry Andrie home on West Douglas street in part payment.

The Williams ranch consists of 160 acres of stock and grain land, the place being well improved. Mr. Andrie plans to erect a new home on the place during the coming winter. The place is now under lease and Mr. Andrie does not gain possession until the first of October. He is not yet decided whether or not he will occupy the ranch or will put it under lease.

## \$2,000,000 IN GEMS TAKEN FROM SHIP SUNK DURING WAR

(Associated Press Leased Wire)  
LORIENT, France, Aug. 1.—A message from Belle Isle today said that a treasure consisting of diamonds and precious stones valued at \$2,000,000, had been recovered by Italian divers from the bulk of the Belgian steamer Elizabethville. The vessel was torpedoed off the coast near here during the closing months of the war.

The divers, who were employed by the Belgian government, found the task exceptionally arduous. They succeeded in locating the treasure a fortnight ago and dynamited the strong room. The explosion caused the flooring to give way and the treasure chest fell to the bottom. It appeared that it would be almost impossible to reach it, but the salvage workers persevered and recovered the jewels.

13 feet, 5 7/16 inches. Drogemuller again shattered the pole vault record, few minutes later when he went over the bar at 4.20 meters or 13 feet, 9 5/16 inches.

Bud Houser held up the United States reputation for strength in the field events by winning the discus championship with an Olympic record-breaking toss of 47.32 meters or 155 feet, 2 1/16 inches.

The Los Angeles dentist thus retained his title won in 1924 when his winning effort was 46.15 meters and broke his own Olympic record set on that occasion which is the equivalent of 151 feet, 5 1/16 inches.

The stars and stripes went up on all three poles for the first time when Charles McGinnis, the little Chicagoan, took third place in the pole vault with 3.95 meters or 12 feet 11 1/8 inches. McGinnis tied with Vic Pickard of Canada and Lee Barnes who shared the Olympic championship in 1924 through a tie with Glenn Graham, for third place today but won the jump-off for the medal. Pickard then beat Barnes for the fourth place point.

## COOPERATION HELD TO HAVE PROVED VALUE IN OREGON

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 1.—Marketing experts from all parts of the United States, returning from the annual convocation of the American Institute of Cooperation at Berkeley, Cal., today inspected cooperative plants in Oregon.

On their way north, the delegates stopped at Medford, Eugene, Corvallis, Tillamook and other Oregon cities inspecting cooperative plants. This afternoon they will go to Hood River, as guests of the Hood River Apple Growers association, and tomorrow they will return here and cross the Columbia river to inspect Washington cooperative organizations.

"Cooperative marketing is not so much a matter of contracts, laws and procedure as it is a matter of heart, spirit, ideals and ideas," declared L. S. Hulbert, senior marketing economist of the division of cooperative marketing, Washington, D. C., last night at a dinner at the Multnomah hotel, where the visitors were guests of the Oregon cooperative council.

In a series of five-minute talks, visiting experts were unanimous in declaring that in efficient mass distribution through cooperative associations lies the solution of many of the difficulties of the farmers.

## TRANS-PACIFIC FLIGHT BELIEVED EIELSON'S PLAN

GRAND FORKS, N. D., Aug. 1.—A flight across the Pacific to Tokyo, Japan, is again reported under consideration by Lieut. Carl Ben Eielson, north Dakota aviator who is resting at his home at Hatton, near here.

This was indicated today when the flier, who piloted Sir Hubert Wilkins across the Arctic fields,

came to Grand Forks for a brief visit. While Eielson made no public statement, it was indicated that the Pacific flight was under consideration by himself and interests in Detroit, and that the outcome of these negotiations would influence his decision with respect to accompanying Wilkins on a south pole expedition.

## INDIAN SCOUT IS VISITOR

Captain O. C. Applegate, noted Indian scout, of Klamath Falls, was a visitor in Roseburg today. Captain Applegate is returning from Yohacalla, where he attended the golden wedding celebration of Mr. and Mrs. George Applegate. He reports that a motion picture of Los Angeles is preparing to start work soon-filming an historical reproduction of the Modoc Indian war. The pictures will be taken at the original setting and will be supervised, for historical exactness by Captain Applegate, who was one of the active participants in that great war, and who achieved fame for his bravery and heroic deeds.

## Markets

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 1.—Liberal receipts of local tomatoes coupled with light demand has knocked the bottom out of the high prices and local wholesalers who have supplies of Walla Walla and California tomatoes on hand were selling below actual cost today to unload. Locals were going around 75c per 20 pound box while shipped in bluffs was being offered from \$1.25 up to \$2.50 with most sales nearer the lower figure.

Peas from the lower Columbia river districts were in generous supply and of average high quality. They moved freely at 8@10c per lb. Beans were also plentiful and sold around 4@5c per lb. First fresh prunes of the season were going to the trade at 75c per 15 lb. lug. They were from the Yakima valley and were of excellent quality.

Other commodities were about steady today with trading quiet. All grades of eggs except medium firsts were higher. Standard extras were 11c higher at 30c, while standard firsts and medium extras were each a cent higher at 29c and 27c respectively. In the latter division, firsts were 1c lower at 41c per pound.

Country dressed meats were steady with the exception of pork which was in light supply and firmer at 10@10 1/2c per pound. Receipts of all classes of meats were moderate and demand slightly improved.

Poultry markets showed no price changes.

## TURKEY GROWERS OF LAKE COUNTY ASK JOIN ASSOCIATION

EUGENE, Aug. 1.—Lake county turkey growers, in meeting yesterday, decided to join the Douglas county growers association in making up a pool for disposing of this year's turkeys, and at the close of the meeting 15 growers had signed up for 3100 birds. A campaign to sign more growers will be made between now and August 14, when the Douglas group will meet and decide whether to cooperate with the Lake growers in the pool.

If the affiliation is made with the Douglas association, Lake county will probably have a director in the organization, it was stated. A committee of Lake growers was appointed some time ago and went over the situation with a committee of Douglas growers on June 29. C. W. Godlove heads the Lake committee.

At yesterday's meeting Mrs. C. G. Brink, manager of an Idaho association, explained the success of Idaho pools and urged cooperative marketing.

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
