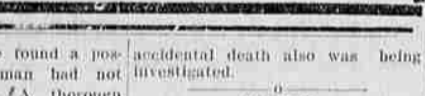

**POLICE PROBING SUPPOSED SUICIDE**

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 22.—The body of Jerome L. Bowers, 64, was found hanging in a shed in the rear of his home late today. While reports indicated the man had committed suicide, police

called to the scene found a possibility that the man had not taken his own life. A thorough investigation was ordered to determine if grounds existed for the suspicion of murder. Relatives living in the house declare that suicide was improbable and insist that foul play caused Bowers' death. Possibility of

accidental death also was being investigated.

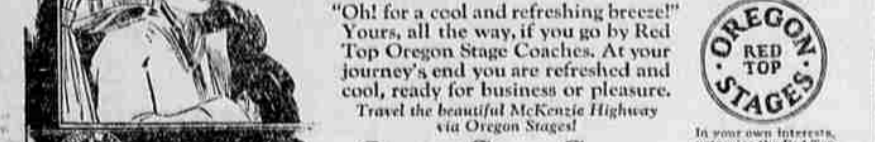

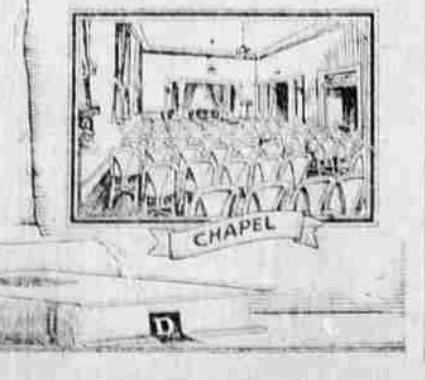
