

Harry C. Stearns' History of Roseburg and the State of Oregon

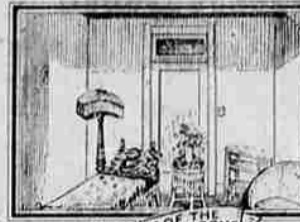
The nations were beginning to awake to the desirability and the value of the northwest, and we now approach an era of more or less noticeable strife.
