duels. Greater consumption is what he needs, along with the elimination of waste and the reduction of the cost of merchant disins.

Hold Back Wheat, Advice  
Secretary Jardine said that "this will be the best agricultural year since the war." He also said that Canada is "raising red" with our grain producers.

"The wheat farmer is not getting as much for his grain as I would like to see him get," Mr. Jardine continued. "This is caused by the great crop in Canada. As this Canadian wheat is all rolled into the world's market at this time, it is responsible for the temporary low price the United States grower is receiving for his wheat."

"With the combine harvester and the fast methods we now have for harvesting, too much of the grain

FOR A KINGDOM

TIRANA, Albania, Aug. 30.—Five thousand Albanians, parading the streets of the capital last night, shouted "We want a kingdom! Long live Zogu!"  
The procession proceeded to the Italian legation, where it acclaimed Premier Mussolini of Italy.  
Foreign Minister Elias Vrioni

has assured the diplomatic corps that the monarchy will prove a factor of stability and peace.  
Reports that the diplomatic corps would leave Tirana when President Achmed Zogu is proclaimed king were denied by Minister of Justice H. Kmet. He declared the change to a monarchy is to be effected with due respect to the constitution.  
The proclamation making Zogu king is expected to be published Saturday.

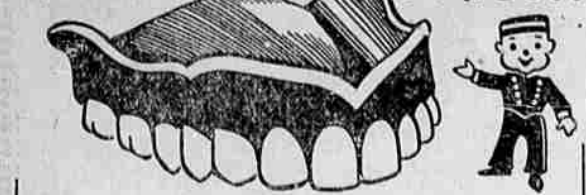

Good Prices Prevail  
"Oregon's beef and mutton producers, as well as the dairy and poultry people, are now enjoying good prices. In fact, the market for these things is the best now that it has been since the low prices of June, 1921. At that time the purchasing power was rated at 67. Today in the commodities named it is 100, and it is above 90 for all the farmers' products. It is practically back to normal for the first time in ten years."

"Before we get off this subject," Secretary Jardine declared, "I want to repeat that I am a crank on the organization of the farmers into a vast unit. It is a day of big organizations. Business has done it, thereby increasing production and wages, and selling the products of their factories at lower
