CITY SCHOOLS OPEN MONDAY SEPTEMBER 17

Registration of Students in High Schools to Start Next Week

PLANS COMPLETED

City Superintendent Compiles Detailed Information for Benefit Parents and Students.

The Roseburg schools will open Monday, September 17, and the school officials are making preparations for a busy time on that date.

For the information of parents and children, City Superintendent W. M. Campbell has compiled information covering the school calendar, attendance rules and textbooks.

School Calendar 1928-29: September 10, registration—12th grade at Senior High; 7th grade at Junior High.

September 11, registration—11th grade at Senior High; 8th grade at Junior High.

September 12, registration—10th grade at Senior High; 9th grade at Junior High.

September 13, registration—9th grade at Junior High.

September 17—School opens.

October 26—First term ends.

November 12—Armistice Day holiday.

November 29-30—Thanksgiving vacation.

December 7—Second term ends.

December 21—School closes for Christmas holidays.

January 2—School resumes.

January 25—Third term and first semester ends.

March 8—Fourth term ends.

April 15—Fifth term ends.

May 26—Baccalaureate services.

May 31—End of semester—Commencement exercises.

All children between and including the ages of nine and fifteen are required to attend school during the time the public school is in session.

All persons of school age whose parents or guardians are registered voters in School District No. 4, Douglas county, Ore., are entitled to attend the public schools free of charge.

Those who live outside of Roseburg may be admitted to the Roseburg public schools upon the payment in advance of each semester's tuition, prior to September 17, 1928, and January 28, 1929, to the school clerk at the rate of \$22.50 per semester in the elementary school of grades 1-6; \$37.50 per semester in the Junior High; and \$50.00 per semester in the Senior High. The tuition charge in the Senior High and in grade nine of the Junior High applies only to those students coming from districts where high schools are maintained.

Each non-resident tax payer of School District No. 4 may be credited each year on any school tuition charges placed against said tax payer by the district school the amount of the actual school tax paid in the district, but not exceeding in any one year the amount of the tuition charge for that year.

Provided, that such credit allowance be extended only to parents or legal guardians of non-resident children in school; that it is not transferable and not cumulative or extending beyond the year in which it is first applied. This credit shall not be applied to any tuition bill which may be charged to any district or county. In order to secure this credit, said non-resident tax payer shall submit to the district clerk his last tax receipt, bearing date not more than one year previous to the date of the tuition charge.

First Grade Classes: New classes in the first grade shall be organized at Rose and Benson schools at the beginning of each semester. New classes are organized in Fullerton at the beginning of the year. No pupil commencing the work of the first year shall enter school during any semester later than the second Monday. Any pupil becoming six years old prior to November 1st, may enter the fall class, while any pupil becoming six years of age prior to June 1st may enter the second semester beginning class, provided there is room for the latter pupils.

School Limits: "B" class pupils living west of the railroad tracks shall attend school at Fullerton. "A" class pupils shall attend at Rose. Pupils in all grades who live on south side of Washington street and south of this street and east of the railroad tracks shall attend school at the Rose building. Pupils living on the north side of Washington street and north from this street and east of the railroad tracks shall attend school at the Benson building. Pupils near these boundaries

may be transferred from one school to another if any grade becomes congested.

Text Books and Supplies: Each pupil shall be furnished by his parents with books and other materials needed in the grade to which he belongs.

Junior High School—Grades 7-9: Any pupil who has satisfactorily completed the sixth grade of any standard school may enter Roseburg Junior High.

Pupils who have taken ninth grade work elsewhere will be given full credit for same if the school attended is standardized by the state department of public instruction; otherwise examinations must be taken in all subjects where credit is desired.

Classification depends upon the number of credits gained. Ninth graders must have 18, eighth graders 17.

Books should not be purchased until after the pupil has registered. Physical Education is required of all students. Gymnasium suits, including rubber soled shoes, are to be provided by all pupils. Boys will use the usual gymnasium white shirt and trunks. Girls will wear 2 1/2" knicker sym trunks and sweater, or the uniform used last year.

Each pupil must have a clean towel for use after physical education class twice a week. These may be brought from home or will be furnished by the district free of charge at cost of 75c a semester.

At registration time each pupil must deposit 75c for a padlock. This will be furnished by the district. At the close of the school year the lock will be returned when the padlock is checked in.

Students will be admitted to Roseburg Senior High school who have gained 6 or more ninth grade credits.

SR. HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL WILL START NEXT WEEK

First Attention to Be Given Interclass Tournaments According to Report of Coach Turner.

Football practice at the senior high school will commence immediately after school opens, according to Coach H. H. 'Hod' Turner.

A new plan will be introduced this year to enable all boys in school to condition themselves at the very first of the season.

The interclass games will be played as usual, and instead of coming in the middle of the season will be played at first.

During the first week of school all of the boys in school who will play on the class teams will be put through a course of instruction in fundamentals of football.

After the class tournaments are out of the way any of the boys who do not desire to try for first team positions will be allowed to drop out, after which all the first squad candidates will be put through a course of intensive training.

Those who show the best results will then be retained on the squad while others will be dropped.

Coach Turner is hoping to develop a strong team this year. He has a number of lettermen back this season, only a few changes in the line-up being necessary.

Added strength will be furnished by experienced players coming up from the junior high school, so that Roseburg should have the best football team that has yet appeared for the school.

A stiff schedule has been arranged for the season which opens here October 13 with a game with Myrtle Creek. Coach Turner expects to make this a seasoning game for his team and expects to make frequent changes in line-up, giving each player an opportunity to show his ability against a visiting team.
