KIDNAPED SON OF HAWAIIAN BANKER SLAIN

Body of Gill Jamieson, 10, Found in Honolulu Near Fashionable Hotel.

WHOLE CITY AROUSED

Murder Committed Despite \$4,000 Ransom Paid by Father; Fiend Still Eludes Police.

(Associated Press Local Wire)

HONOLULU, Sept. 21.—Indignation meetings and hints that a vigilance committee was being formed to hunt down and lynch the kidnaper and slayer of 10-year-old Gill Jamieson were added to the burden of peace officers today as they continued their efforts to find the abductor.

The body of the boy, a son of Frederick W. Jamieson, Honolulu banker, was found on the banks of the Royal canal, near the fashionable Alala Hawaiian hotel, yesterday. Physicians said the boy died of suffocation by strangulation. Police Surgeon Robert C. Faus said that an autopsy indicated the boy had put up a terrific struggle with his abductor. Gill's neck bore the imprint of fingers, many bruises covered his body, there were rope burns on his wrists and ankles.

Physicians said he probably had been killed Tuesday night, a few hours after the frenzied father handed \$4,000 to a man who promised to return the boy unharmed.

Impetus was given the search after the body had been found. Honolulu met with horror its first major crime and began organizing police military and volunteers into workable units to seek the abductor.

Indignation meetings were held by citizens in all quarters of the city.

The Chamber of Commerce reward fund reached \$10,000 last night and was expected to exceed \$20,000 by tonight.

At one of the citizens' meetings newspaper men were barred—vigilance committee was being formed. There is no record of a previous lynching in Hawaii because crime has been practically negligible. The low crime rate is attributed to the isolation of Hawaii and the impossibility of long flights from the scene of a crime.

Every possible avenue of escape was being closely guarded by sheriff's deputies. All ships leaving the coast were watched.

PLAGUE MENACES STORM-HIT AREAS AID CALL URGENT

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla., Sept. 21.—The plague specter today appeared over the Florida everglades, scarcely five days behind the hurricane that took between 500 and 800 lives.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21.—The American Red Cross today called on the American public for a minimum of \$5,000,000 to provide relief for sufferers from the hurricane in Florida, Porto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

John Barton Payne, chairman of the relief organization based his request on reports from the stricken areas indicating that 400,000 persons in Porto Rico and 15,000 families in Florida will require assistance.

Business in Roseburg on the Upgrade

Banks and Mercantile Establishments Report Sales to Be on Increase; Indications Point to Future Prosperous Period.

General business conditions in Roseburg are showing a steady improvement, according to local business men who are in touch with the situation. While the city, together with others of the coast, has been going through a period of depression, indications now point to an upgrade movement, and it is believed that a material improvement will mark the fall and winter months.

BULGIN SEEKS \$500 DAMAGES FOR "CUSSING"

Abusive Treatment From Road Patrolman Claimed in Letter to County.

CONNECTIONS MISSED

Was Returning From Hunting Trip, He Says, and Was Denied Passage Over Bridge.

E. J. Bulgín, noted evangelist, well known in Roseburg where he held an evangelistic meeting a few years ago, has filed a claim against the county for damages in the sum of \$500, which he claims is rightly due him for standing for a "cussing" delivered by John Gilmore, road patrolman at Tillamook, Oregon, questioned by county officers, admits the causing and adding a few more expletives that he forgot on the first round.

It appears that the evangelist, who was recently in Portland, had one of his hunters, who went into the Tillamook district before the opening of the deer season planning to kill a deer on the opening day. He started back on Monday, September 10, of this year when the season was not open, and found that Mr. Gilmore had caused the bridge over Dumont creek to be torn out while a new one was being constructed. The creek is about 21 miles above Tillamook on the South Umpqua river.

According to Gilmore's statement, the evangelist, who studied for the law before becoming a professional exhorter, arrived at the creek at a time when there was no way across the stream, and immediately ordered the crew to prepare him a passage-way. HUNTERS FINED FOR FAILURE TO TAG DEER MEAT

U. P. Downing, Carl Olson and Harry L. Robinson, residents of Beaverton, Oregon, were fined \$100 each in the local justice court today for having untagged venison in their possession. They entered pleas of guilty to the charge.

According to Ed Walker, deputy state game warden, who made the arrests, he received word a few days ago that these hunters were in the vicinity of Giles camp, 12 miles above Tillamook, and that they were shooting everything that jumped up and were slaughtering everything in sight. He also received the report, he said, that they were hunting at night with spotlights. He investigated the reports and remained in that vicinity for three nights in an effort to apprehend them hunting at night, and while he saw the men in the woods with flashlights, he heard no shots and so was able to make no arrests on that charge.

He went to their camp, however, to make an investigation and found the carcasses of five deer, all on the smoking rack except one. On four of the deer there was no mark of sex. Hides could not be shown and the hunters claimed that they did not bring in the horns. The game warden stated that he could not find blades of two fawns near the camp.

Democratic Nominee Flays Religious Opposition in Bold Address.

"WHISPERERS" RAKED

(Associated Press Staff Writer) OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Sept. 21.—Governor Smith wants the American people to decide the November presidential election on the records of the two major parties and their nominees and not on religious grounds.

Before a demonstrative audience that packed this city's coliseum last night the democratic presidential nominee minced no words in an effort to drive home his point.

Declaring he had been forced to drag the religious question into the open because of "an apparent widespread attempt" to distract the American people from the "real issues" by circulation of un-American secret propaganda involving his Catholic faith, and moral habits, the governor struck a blow at those he believed responsible, challenged his opponents to find a single "scandal" in his long legislative and gubernatorial record and appealed to the people not to be swayed by religious prejudice in casting their ballots.

The republican national committee, Mrs. Mabel Walker Willebrandt, assistant attorney general, the Ku Klux Klan, the Fellowship Forum, a fraternal publication of Washington, D. C., and former Senator Owen of this state, a democratic boiler—all were mentioned by name in the address, which the governor said would be his last on the subject of "whispering, tolerance and Tammany."

Water power probably will be the theme of his third speech of the western tour and today he turned toward Denver, where he will deliver that address tomorrow night.
