### UMPQUA HIGHWAY DISTRICT OFFICERS PLAN BOND ISSUE

The trustees of the Umpqua Improvement district met in Roseburg today to arrange for the issuance of bonds for the purpose of for use in completing the Drain-Scottsburg section of the Umpqua highway. The bond issue was authorized at the last general election by a vote of nearly three-to-one and is a continuation of the tax paid by the residents of that section who have in the past been paying ten mills annually into the super road district fund. The bonds will bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent. It is planned to receive bids December 3. The money will be turned over to the highway commission to be expended in cooperation with government and state funds.
