# PARAGUAY OFFERED RICKARD ARMY TO BATTLE BOLIVIA

### Fight Promoter Tells How He Missed Opportunity to Stage Melee in South America.

(Associated Press Local Wire) NEW YORK, Dec. 12.—Tex Rickard made known today that in 1912 he lost a chance to promote the biggest fight of his career—a war between Bolivia and Paraguay.

Richard spent eight years in Paraguay, going there in 1912 with twenty Texan cowboys sent by the Paraguayan government to engage in the cattle industry and development of the country's resources.

"In 1913," said Rickard, "I came up through the Argentine with twenty cowboys, 50,000 head of cattle and a train of about fifty wagons, with the idea of crossing into Paraguay across the Pilcomayo river, the boundary between Paraguay and the Argentine."

"Well, as soon as we got into Paraguay we came across a lot of fighting in the battle of Paraguay, and that vexed them a bit. It was the first they'd heard of it, I guess."

Offered Whole Army "Anyway, they all came around to me, the president, the cabinet and every one, and they told me that if I'd go out and fight the Bolivians they'd give me all the soldiers I wanted and more. They'd give me an army, in fact. Well, I didn't like to act without instructions, so I wired to my people in Buenos Aires and they called to Mr. Farquhar in Paris. He didn't want a war, though; he had too much at stake. And so I missed my chance to lead an army."

The promoter of pugilistic fights said he still owns 500 square miles of land in the Gran Chaco, the disputed territory. He said he had granted grazing privileges to a group of Americans and that the land might come in useful some day.

# FRENCH SENATOR, UNDER BAD CHECK CHARGE, RESIGNS

PARIS, Dec. 12.—Lucien Kloz, former minister of finance in the Clemenceau cabinet, resigned his membership in the French senate today.

Kloz was the subject of charges filed by the police prosecutor to France two days ago to the effect that he had issued bank checks without sufficient funds in the institutions on which they were drawn. This is a criminal offense in France and the prosecutor asked the Senate to lift parliamentary immunity from M. Kloz.

The former minister has been a patient in a sanitarium and his friends have stated that his collapse was due to losses on the New York stock exchange. He was generally considered wealthy, as he was the owner of a large perfume establishment.
