

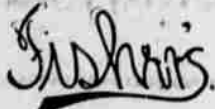

NO FANCY CLOTHES FOR STUDENTS OF CHINA'S SCHOOLS

Canton Officials Decree Cotton for All Instead of Western Woollens and Silks.

CANTON, Dec. 12.—Imported
Western-styled clothing which has
been all the rage among college
students, both men and women,
throughout south China is to be
abolished by the Canton govern-
ment. In its place is to be sub-
stituted a semi-military cotton uni-
form for the boys and black cotton
skirts, white blouses and cotton
stockings for the girls.
The south China government will
have none of what it terms "un-

justified tastes for luxuries" among the college students. With the opening of the new year the imported woollens and accompanying gay haberdashery for men and the fragile silks and satins so popular among the girl students are to be prohibited in the universities of south China.
Founder is Obedient
During the life of Sun Yat-sen, founder of the Chinese national party, he brought into being what has come to be known as the "Chung Shan uniform," comprised of trousers without cuffs and semi-military coat with standup collar for men and cotton skirt, white blouse and cotton stockings for women. These are soon to be the official uniforms for the students of south China. "Chung Shan" is a ceremonial name meaning Yat-sen. Sun during the latter part of his life never wore any other style of clothing.
Government officials fear the minds of the students are more concerned with money-spending, fashions and extravagances than they are with books and lectures. Co-education has been established in south China, but due to the shortage of school buildings the regulations have not yet been put

into full effect, but are being enforced as rapidly as additional school buildings can be supplied.
Although fancy dresses, silk stockings and high heeled shoes have been barred to the girls the custom of hobbled hair, also frowned on by the authorities, is expected to remain as it has become practically universal among the women and girls of south China.

AMERICANIZATION OF SLAVIC RULERS PLEASES SUBJECTS

BELEGRADE, June 24.—King, Dec. 13.—King Alexander and Queen Marie have pleased their subjects by some Americanization. When the king returned recently from Paris, where he underwent an operation at the hands of American surgeons, his own subjects did not recognize him. Indeed, his own children, little Crown Prince Peter and Princess Tomislav, did not know him. This was not due to any physical change in the king. He had shaved off his moustache, and adopting American civilian dress, which altered his whole appearance.
A smartly cut light grey suit, and a hat of the same grey which had replaced the king's customary dull military uniform and tall army cap, which made Alexander look ten years younger.
Not to be outdone by the king, the queen had her beautiful golden hair bobbed American style, and brought back from Paris six trunksfuls of gowns, and the latest styles in hats, lingerie and footwear. Friends who came to greet her at the railroad station commented upon her strikingly smart and girlish appearance, and said that she and the king resembled newweds.

VACCINATION URGED
A case of smallpox was reported at the county home this morning, according to Dr. DeWalt Payne, county health officer. The home has been placed in quarantine and everything possible will be done to prevent any spread of the disease. It is recommended, however, that persons not vaccinated receive vaccination through their family physicians at once, as the present weather is favorable to the spread of epidemics and all possible precautions should be taken. So far as is known this is the only case of smallpox in the vicinity, but several persons are known to have been exposed.

DATE PRUNES PROVE POPULAR XMAS GIFT

The holiday boxes of fancy date prunes, recommended by the chamber of commerce as attractive Christmas gifts to friends residing in other states, are proving very popular. Twenty-two boxes were purchased yesterday and a great number will probably be sold today, it was indicated. The boxes sold so far this week have been sent to nearly every state in the Union, and one has even gone to Alaska. The popularity of the date prune has been evidenced by the fact that several repeat orders have been received from California.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13.—Wholesale prices:
Raw milk, 1 per cent, \$2.53 cwt. delivered Portland; less 1 per cent butterfat, station 32c; track, 33c; delivered at Portland, 55c.

Poultry (buying prices)—live, heavy hens (over 4 1/2 pounds), 24@ 25c; medium hens (3 1/2 to 4 1/2 lbs.), 20c; light (under 3 1/2 pounds), 17c; springs, 21c; ducks, 15@20c; turkeys, dressed, No. 1, 22@24c; second, 17@18c.

Eggs, unions, potatoes, wool, nuts, hay, cascara bark and hops, steady.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13.—Butter prices were stronger today with extras at 59 cents, standards at 49, prime firsts 45 and firsts at 47 cents. All these prices are about one cent higher except prime firsts steady. No change in eggs or poultry. Butterfat rose one cent to 23 cents on track and 25 at Portland.

Spinach from The Dalles is on the local market today at 7 cents a pound. Local bunch vegetables, including parsley, beets, carrots, turnips and radishes are plentiful and of good quality. Average price ranges around 40 to 45 cents per dozen bunches.

Tomatoes, repacked, are slightly lower, priced from \$2.75 to \$3 with original selling at \$2.25 to \$2.50. Some hot house tomatoes have arrived and are selling at 45c.

Sweet potatoes are lower, priced around 4 1/2 to 4 3/4 cents with Pacific Around at \$2.75 to \$3 per bushel. Local cauliflower and California stock are competing on the market, at a price range of \$1.50 to \$1.75 for good stock.

Christmas fruits continue at low prices. Naval oranges are quoted from \$4.50 to \$5.75. Lemons are lower at \$4 to \$7. Grapefruit from \$4.50 to \$5. Apple prices remain fairly steady.
