CHICAGO CITIZENS DEMAND PROBE OF PAYROLL FRAUD

(Associated Press Special Wire) CHICAGO, Dec. 31.—Placing of "official" responsibility for the looting of the sanitary district treasury and an inquiry into the reputed padding of the district's payroll was asked today by the citizens' association in a petition to the state's attorney. The "waste of millions of dollars in public funds could not have occurred except through a conspiracy on the part of the sanitary district engineers," the association charged. It asked a grand jury investigation.

The names of two thousand or more persons, "real or fictitious, many of whom did no work," were placed on the payroll, the association charged, "solely for political purposes." Augustus S. Peabody, president, promised the association's fullest cooperation to State's Attorney John A. Swanson.

But he did not send for the shak- ing young man who paced the room in a fever of fear and dread. In 20 minutes he was back and Alester turned to him as a drowning man

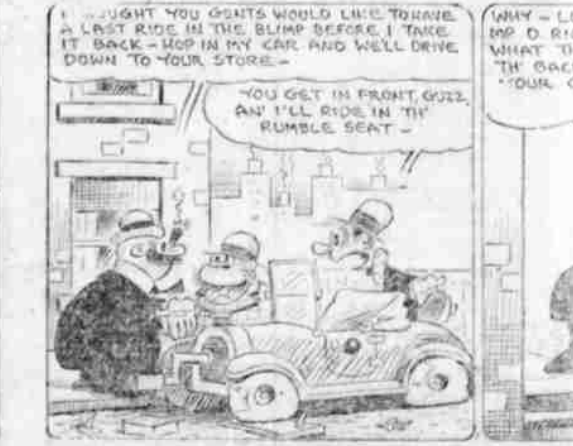

CHICAGO, Jan. 1.—William Wrigley, Jr., is a man with a \$6,000,000 hobby. Wrigley, who built one of America's largest fortunes on a stick of chewing gum, has perhaps the most expensive hobby in the world. It is baseball. Six million dollars has William Wrigley, Jr., invested in this hobby through ownership of three baseball clubs, the Chicago Cubs, the Los Angeles Pacific Coast league and the Reading International. Yet he admits he has never banked a cent on his investment for himself. He wants just one return—a thrill. And he hopes to get his biggest thrill next season by cheering his Cubs to a national league pennant. Not since 1918 have the Cubs won a pennant, but with Rogers Hornsby in their lineup, Wrigley visions the prize all but won.
