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Prevention of Hereditary Diseases Would Eliminate Heavy Annual Expense for Taxpayers of State

An interesting article dealing with a report of the Oregon State Board of Eugenics, showing the cost to the taxpayers of Oregon of mental deficiency as a result of heredity and advocating a more flexible sterilization law, has been prepared by Dr. DeWalt Payne as follows:

Prevention of Hereditary Diseases
There are probably only two truly inherited diseases, namely Huntington's chorea and hemophilia (bleeders) but the tendency to contract diseases of certain types has been definitely demonstrated to be inherited. This tendency toward disease is known as a diathesis. In these diseases heredity has been shown to have some part in the causation of cancer, tuberculosis, asthma, hay fever, skin diseases, epilepsy, and practically all forms of nervous and mental disease.

Of the forms of inherited disease in which the public as taxpayers should be interested, there are principally tuberculosis, which is readily preventable but prolonged and difficult of cure, and mental deficiencies most of which do not respond to treatment.

Obviously a study and application of eugenics is necessary in all these diseases, but the ones which cost the commonwealth the most money and in which the individual is not responsible for the application of eugenics are mental diseases.

Below are some figures from the proposed 1929 State of Oregon budget: Schools, \$2,893,247; state market roads, \$1,122,332.18; Oregon state board of health, \$32,370; bureau of nursing and child hygiene, \$12,250; penal institutions, \$355,750; mental hospitals, \$883,000.

The Jukes family, all from five daughters of a lazy and irresponsible fisherman born in New York in 1723 has cost the state of New York over one million and a quarter dollars in five generations and the cost is still going on.

Oregon has made a slight step to protect itself by the creation of a state board of eugenics. A portion of its biennial report is hereby submitted:

"Dr. Henry H. Goddard has investigated and compiled the results of his work on the heredity of a most remarkable family in the Kallikak family. During the Revolutionary days, the first Martin Kallikak (the name is fictitious), descended from a long line of good English ancestry, took advantage of a feeble-minded girl, a feeble-minded son. This son married a normal woman. They in turn produced five feeble-minded and two normal children. Practically all of the descendants of these defectives have been traced, as well as those of the two nor-

mal. The tragic story follows: "From both normal and defective descendants of this union came a long line of defective stock. There were 180 in all. Of these 34 were illegitimate, 33 sexually immoral, 24 confirmed alcoholists, and 2 epileptics. Eighty-two died in infancy, 3 were criminals, 8 kept houses of ill fame, and 147 were distinctly feeble-minded. Only 46 were found who were apparently normal. The rest are unknown or doubtful. But the action of the good family who started this long line of delinquent and defective progeny is also responsible for a strain of an entirely different character. After the Revolutionary war was over, he married a Quaker girl of good ancestry and settled down to live a respectable life after the traditions of his forefathers. From this legal union with a normal woman, there have been 496 descendants. All of these except two have been of a normal mentality. The exceptions were cases of insanity, presumably inherited through marriage with an outside strain in which there was a constitutional psychopathic tendency. In all the 496 there is not an instance of feeble-mindedness. The offspring descended from this side of the house have universally occupied positions in the upper walks of life. They have never been criminals or ne'er-do-wells. On the other hand, there has not been a single instance of exceptional ability among the descendants of the first Martin Kallikak and the feeble-minded girl. Many of these descendants have failed to rise above the dead level of mediocrity; indeed, most of them have fallen far below even this minimum standard.

"The fact that the descendants of both the normal and the feeble-minded mother have been traced and studied in every conceivable environment, and that the respective strains have always been true to type tends to confirm the belief that heredity has been the determining factor in the formation of their respective characters. In the cities the descendants of the legal marriage with the normal woman are physicians, lawyers and prominent business men, while the descendants of the feeble-minded mother are almost invariably found in the slums. In the rural districts the descendants of the normal mother and her consort are wealthy and influential farmers, while the others never rise above the rank of farm laborers, and are shiftless men and women, who are unable to subsist without the aid of charity. Many representatives of the defective branch are inmates of almshouses, while there are no paupers at all among the normal descendants.

"Many of the inmates of the Oregon penitentiary, Oregon state

hospital, eastern Oregon hospital, institution for the feeble-minded are there because they are the descendants of defective parents. A still larger number are allowed to remain at large and propagate their kind. The Oregon state board of eugenics is trying to solve this problem in this state.

"Sterilization is an effective means of controlling the propagation of the defective.

"Eleven states have formed laws providing for the sterilization of defectives. California has a law which permits the superintendents of state institutions before discharging a patient to perform an operation which will prevent procreation.

"The procedure must be approved according to the law by the secretary of the state board of health and in practice the consent of the patient's nearest relatives.

"Oregon adopted its first eugenic law in 1917 and the present law was enacted in 1922 as the first law was declared unconstitutional by the lower court. Operations have been performed in four institutions: the state hospital, institution for the feeble-minded, eastern Oregon hospital, and the state penitentiary.

"The present Oregon eugenic law is cumbersome in its action and there is much unnecessary detail required to comply with its restrictions. The law could be simplified in many ways. The meeting of the eleven members of the board at frequent intervals requires the attendance of busy men who cannot afford to give the time that this work requires. A smaller number of professional men could carry out this examination in probably a more satisfactory manner than is possible at present. The law requires the consent of the patient.

"Most of the persons examined are absolutely incompetent and their signatures of consent are practically meaningless. Most states require the consent of the guardian and to this procedure there are no objections except when the guardian happens to be another incompetent as the parents of such individuals frequently are.

"An examination form containing only the necessary facts would reduce the amount of clerical work. If the work is to be of real

service to the state it must be financed so that some one can give his entire time to the investigation and following up of the cases.

"An amendment to the law to simplify the procedure of the board will be submitted to the legislature."

It is obvious that the cost to taxpayers for the support of defectives and the protection of themselves will triple and quadruple from generation to generation.

The overcrowding of our institutions presses pressure on our parole boards and many defectives are released before their time is up and they usually propagate to kind.

Sterilization of the habitual criminal would be more effective as a deterrent to crime than capital punishment. Shouldn't new laws be made for the protection of our homes and your taxes?

G. A. R. PROTESTS PLANS TO HONOR "TRAITORS"

LAKE MILLS, Wis., Jan. 1.—In a letter to members of the G. A. R., department of Wisconsin, G. M. Founders, commander, and E. B. Neimstreet, assistant adjutant general, vigorously attacked the introduction of two congressional bills by Representative Bulwinkle of North Carolina and asked for a petition of protest from all members.

The bills asked that the marine band be in attendance at the Confederate veterans' reunion at Charlotte, N. C., June 4 to 7, 1929, and that the secretary of war provide banding for use during the encampment.

"It is the duty of every union veteran and every loyal citizen to protest against the bills just introduced and all further honoring of those who have been so honored only because they were rebels and traitors," the letter said.

EDMONTON, Alberta, Dec. 25.—Two persons were dead today and a third was in a hospital as a result of a Christmas murder, and suicide.

Harry Ewaschuk, 35, went to the home of Mrs. John Hivishka, early Christmas morning and shot her twice in the head while her 15-year-old daughter helplessly looked on. He cut off the woman's head and took it with him when he left the house.

Returning home Ewaschuk told his wife what he had done and then ended his life. Police believed a family quarrel was the cause of the slayings.
