39c**AND UP****PADEFORD AND MARCUS TO APPEAR ON BOXING CARD**

The next local boxing card is to be held on Wednesday, January 30, according to Promoter Clyde Ward. This card will feature a 10-round main event between Pat Padelord of Medford and Joe Marcus of Portland. Padelord, who is well known to local fans, is making a rapid climb toward the top of his class. He has been training conscientiously and the results are shown in his fine condition.

Padelford is a natural fighter who packs a terrific wallop. He has a long reach which gives him considerable advantage over the majority of the fighters in the 135-pound class, as most of the boxers of that weight are short and solid, but Padelord, being long and rangy, with a heavy punch in either hand and a great deal of speed, is usually able to keep away from infighting and has been consequently winning regularly by knockouts.

Marcus is well known to all boxing fans. He has been fighting main events in Portland, and this will be one of his first fights outside the metropolis. His ability is known to all followers of boxing activities and his reputation was further enhanced by his long string of victories during a recent trip to Australia.

Padelford has been working for considerable time to procure a fight with Marcus. If he can beat the Portland boy "Pat" will step immediately into main event fights in the city with a chance at big money.

Mr. Ward states that he has not yet arranged the rest of the card. The semi-final, however, will be a heavyweight fight with young Jess Willard, a 270-pound newcomer in fistie circles, matched with some other heavyweight.

Tiger Dunn, who has been fighting special events, will be used again if some good opponent can be found. Dunn has had only three fights and due to his lack of experience and training is still in the ordinary class. His natural ability coupled with his terrific punching power, has given him two knockouts and a decision in his three engagements and already he is superior to the ordinary run of preliminary fighters and it is very difficult to secure a fight for him without overmatching him.

CHARLES E. MILLS**NOTED FINANCIER.****MINING MAN. DIES**

PHOENIX, Ariz., Jan. 17.—Charles E. Mills, 61 years old, president of the Valley banks of Arizona, and one of the best-known mining men and financiers in the southwest, died here today, after a short illness. Doctors said death resulted from an attack of influenza and pneumonia.

Mr. Mills was head of the chain of "Valley Banks" in Arizona, which he organized in 1914 and president of the Apache Power company of Benson, Ariz. He founded the Detroit Copper company and International Smelter company, both of Miami, Ariz.

Mr. Mills was unmarried. He was born in Cedar Rapids Iowa, was a graduate of Harvard university and moved to Arizona in 1885. He served with Roosevelt's "rough riders" in the Spanish-American war and with the government aircraft board during the World war.

victs the means whereby it might be prevented and cured. His work contributed largely to the general knowledge of nutrition. He discovered the vitamin "pp" or pellagra preventive, and showed that dried yeast contains it, and this is an inexpensive safeguard against the malady.

Surgeon General Cumming of the public health service paid a tribute to Dr. Goldberger's work, declaring it was one of the outstanding contributions to medicine.
