JACOB SCHAEFER BILLIARD CHAMP FOR FIFTH TIME

(Associated Press Special Wire)
NEW YORK, Feb. 14.—Jacob Schaefer of Chicago, still "Young Jake" despite 34 years of age and a dozen years of major competition, is the world's 182 ballline billiards champion for the fifth time in a period of just over seven years. By triumphing over Walter Cochran, Hollywood, can star, by the narrow margin of 406 to 225 in the final match of the international tournament, Schaefer won his third championship tournament and his fifth title. Twice he defeated other titleholders in challenge matches under the now-abandoned system.

The brilliant son of the "wizard" of billiards, old Jake Schaefer, won his first tournament in 1921 and played through to victory again in 1925. Schaefer, who made his first public appearance as a billiardist in exhibitions with his father when he was only six years old, was at his brilliant best last night. Cochran was not far behind, losing his chance at a second championship through two costly fouls. Twice when he was in the middle of good runs with chances of overtaking his opponent, he lost out by touching the ball one time with his cue and a second with the tip of his cue before it had stopped moving.

Last night's victory gave Schaefer a record of four matches won and one lost in the round robin tournament which started at the Levee Club February 4. Eric Hagelbacher, who finished fifth in the standing, scored a 406 to 361 victory Thursday. With this Schaefer won a cash prize of \$2,000 and a contract for one year at a salary of \$6,000 to represent a firm manufacturing billiard tables.

Although defeated twice, Cochran won second money of \$1,450 and a year's contract at \$3,000 by making the best average of the three who finished with three victories and two defeats. For the five matches, Cochran averaged 25.47-11 billiards an inning.

Horeman, last year's champion, took third money, \$1,000 on the grand average basis, while Kinross Matsuyama, tiny Japanese who performed so sensationally up to his last two matches, won fourth prize of \$1,000.

TED THYE WINNER OVER KOSTONAROS IN 19 MINUTES

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 14.—Ted Thye, former holder of the world's light heavyweight wrestling championship, flashed all of his old time ring generalship and mat cunning here last night when he defeated George Kostonaros, Greek grappler from Hollywood, in one of the shortest matches seen here. There was just 19 minutes, 9 seconds of actual wrestling. Thye took the first and third with his famous wristlock hold in falls of one minute 10 seconds and 4 minutes 30 seconds, respectively. Kostonaros won the second fall in 13 minutes 30 seconds with a flying mare following a series of sawing headlocks.

Walter Johnson, Portland, was awarded the preliminary on a foul from Pat McCarthy, Boston, after McCarthy had kicked Johnson in the stomach.

GANGSTER OF 12 CHATTERS GLIBLY OF HIS MISDEEDS

CHICAGO, Feb. 13.—Twelve-year-old Joe Dowling, who carries a gun and has a gang, told police today he had taken part in 150 burglaries since the time he was nine years old. When arrested last night he was offering a \$150 diamond ring for sale for \$5. Dowling had a loaded pistol in his pocket, a flashlight and a ring of keys. Two boys, one nine the other 13, were arrested at the same time, but Dowling told police they had been on only three "jobs" and were "amateurs." He was asked about the pistol. "A guy's gotta have a gun," said the boy, who is small for his years. "Suppose the cops caught me, and I had a chance to shoot it out with them? I've had bits of guns. Some I got in flats. One time me and a kid named Coughlin—he's doing a stretch now—stole a car and drove to Gary, Ind., and bought two shot guns from a guy. On the way back Coughlin took a shot at a farmer in a field and knocked his hat off."

Police said they had verified several of the burglaries to which the boy confessed.
