

PLAN FOR ONE BOARD REGENTS BEFORE SENATE

Membership of Nine, With Control of All Funds Provided For.

VOTE LIKELY TODAY

House Turns Down Old Age Pension Measure and Bill to Abolish \$2 Auto Fee.

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 21.—The Board-Schoolmen bill, providing that one board of regents administer affairs of the University of Oregon, Oregon State college, and the three state normal schools, considered one of the most important measures before the legislature, was tabled by the senate after a long debate today in which it was expected to be voted on. It is expected to be on the calendar Friday.

The senate passed Senator Fisher's bill authorizing the creation of tunnel districts, and Byrnes' bill, extending authority of the corporation commissioner over building and loan associations.

Board of 9 Approved
Senator Ball, defending the bill to consolidate the regent boards of the institutions of higher learning, said it would "get away from a condition that has become more or less intolerable and that interference with legislation at every session."

The bill as finally approved in a conference that included the presidents of the university and the college and representatives of the normal schools, provided for the board of nine who would have control of all funds according to them. It would not disturb the executive administration of any institution. If it passes it will be effective July 1, this year.

Senators Dunne and J. O. Bailey withdrew bills introduced by them to give greater freedom of beneficiaries to appeal from decisions of the industrial accident commission.

The senate killed by indefinite postponement house bill 467, empowering the labor commission to collect wage claims, and house bill 413, extending the lien privilege on fish wheels, gear and boats.

The senate adopted the joint resolution by Dunne and J. O. Bailey providing for the appointment of a narcotic commission.

Get Senate's Approval
Other measures passed by the senate were:

S. B. 184, by Hunt and Marks—Repealing the incorporation and organization of domestic insurance companies.

S. B. 229, by joint committee on Insurance—Providing for fire insurance coverage on fallen buildings.

H. B. 48, by committee on repeal of laws—Adopting official name for normal schools.

H. B. 277, by Winslow—Relating to building and loan associations.

H. B. 176, by Robinson—Fixing bounty of 50 cents on sea lions and \$10 on seals.

H. B. 389, by Russell and Thompson—Relating to transportation for students in high school districts.

H. B. 241, by Louerger—Providing for a delinquent tax roll and authorizing the cancellation of delinquent personal property taxes in certain cases.

H. B. 388, by Byrnes—Extending corporation commissioners power of regulation over building and loan associations.

H. B. 371, by Hallett—Placing restrictions on withdrawals from union high school districts.

Five Bills Slain
SALEM, Ore., Feb. 21.—Completely swamped with 37 opposition votes, the old age pension bill

was killed in the lower house Thursday morning.

Senator Bailey's bill to repeal the chauffeurs' license fee of \$2 per year, was killed in the house Thursday morning by the indefinite postponement vote. The automobiles and roads committee of the house returned an adverse report on the bill on the claim that such repeal would deprive the state highway department of approximately \$25,000 annual revenue.

Two fish bills, house bill 335 and 475, both introduced by Robinson, were also killed by the indefinite postponement vote. Substituted bills have been introduced to the senate, said Robinson.

The Wilkes and Tompkins bill providing that in any trial, failure to testify against himself, may be commented upon by the district attorney to the jury, was also killed by indefinite postponement.

Wants Fish Board
Because "unending" contention between commercial and sport fishermen in the state, brings a grave danger that the supply of fish in this state for both commercial and sport purposes will be depleted to an injurious extent," Childs of Linn county has introduced a resolution to the house that a commission be appointed to formulate uniform laws governing both sport and commercial fishing to assure an adequate supply of fish in the streams of this state for all purposes.

tried, however, irrigation, either by pumping systems or by hand, was more generally practiced, with the result that growers have about a 75 per cent stand, which, under the conditions that have prevailed, is considered exceptionally good.

Mr. Petty expects that the carload shipments will be made only from Roseburg and Myrtle Creek. The crop in the Riddle district, he reports, is so light that the loading will probably be done at the Myrtle Creek warehouse.

The heads are now commencing to form, and the first carload shipments, Mr. Petty believes, will be made about March 15.

Mr. Petty went into the fields in every part of the county and cut open the plants that appeared to have suffered the most damage and found that while the plants appeared to be frost-burned and wilted, that the stalk and bottom were absolutely unharmed. Based upon this inspection, which was very thorough, Mr. Petty is quite sure that the loss will be very nominal and that the crop will be almost as large as anticipated.

CHICAGO POLICE GET CAR USED BY GANG MURDERERS

Discovery Due to Attempt to Deface Auto With Torch That Sets Garage Afire.

CHICAGO, Feb. 22.—The killer's car used in last week's gang massacre has been found, police said today, in a garage not three miles from the scene of the multiple murder.

Efforts to destroy it led to the discovery, for an acetylene torch used to cut through the steel frame ignited the garage. Firemen, finding the machine, called police, and police, after a careful survey including the photographs of fingerprints inside the garage and on parts of the car, believed themselves near solution of the worst gang outrage in Chicago history.

Early today Deputy Police Commissioner John Stagg said: "There is good reason to believe the Moran murders will be cleared up within a few hours."

Arrests followed quickly after police established their own satisfaction the identity of the automobile. Half a dozen arrests had been made by midnight, and shortly before dawn a squad had went out on a secret mission which Lieutenant William Cusack, squad leader, said would solve the slayings.

Dry Order Credited
Police Commissioner Russell's sweeping command for a search of all garages or other buildings fronting on alleys probably prompted the hurried effort to destroy the motor car. The commissioner's order was directed primarily at mopping up the city's liquor supply, much of which is believed to be stored in garages or other alley buildings. It apparently created alarm in an entirely unexpected quarter—among the killers themselves.

The machine was an 1928 model touring car of the type used by mobile squads of the police department. It was found almost completely dismantled, with identifying marks removed, with two wheels off and with parts of a body burned or cut away by a hacksaw and acetylene torch which were found in the garage.

A small silver, such as is used on police cars, was found nearby. The tires, all new, had been stripped from the rims. The radiator had been taken off and was standing against the wall.

A gray fedora hat and a luger automatic pistol were found in the garage.

Shadow of Al Capone
The owner of the garage, located in the heart of "Little Italy," is Leo Joppe, who operates a grocery store. He told of seeing the garage on February 12—two days before the gang killing—to a

"Mr. Rogers" who said he wanted it for a month and paid in advance.

"Rogers" gave his address as 1527 West North Avenue, which was found fictitious. That address, however, is next door to "The Circus" cafe, a playground for gangsters and a favorite hangout, police said, for those who follow the leadership of Al Capone. It is across the street from the home of Pasquale Lohrke, slain successor to the Sicilian gang leadership following the slaying of Tony Lombardo, pal of Capone.

"The Circus" was raided two weeks ago and a machine gun was found. Police returned last night and made several arrests.

Persons living near the Joppe garage told of strange goings and comings during the past week, but none apparently had taken particular notice of the men.

Joppe was taken to the identification bureau where he sought to find a picture of "Mr. Rogers" in the rogues' gallery. Police would not say what the result of the visit was.

Whatever effect the discovery of the killers' car may have upon previous theories concerning the murders, police pointed out that it widened the circle of persons who had been the slayers, and provided a much broader scope for investigation.

The Joppe garage is at the rear of 1723 North Wood street. The murder of the George (Bugs) Moran gangsters took place in a garage at 2122 North Clark street, about 16 blocks east of Wood street.

The police order to dry up Chicago, entailing the search of any place in the city where the sale or storage of liquor is suspected, including "beer flats," was having a marked effect today, the several district captains reported. In the loop district police said they did not believe a single gambling place or "booze joint" was in operation.
