BOSTON, Mar. 30.—The Commercial Bulletin today says:

"The week in the American wool market has been well-nigh featureless. Manufacturers, while fairly busy on old contracts, are not in pressing need of wool at the moment apparently."

"In the wool there is nothing being done of moment. A few options taken in western Idaho late last week have been allowed to lapse. Foreign markets are generally steady. Bradford and continental markets are rather quiet."

"Mohair is slow and prices are difficult to quote with certainty." Scoured basis:

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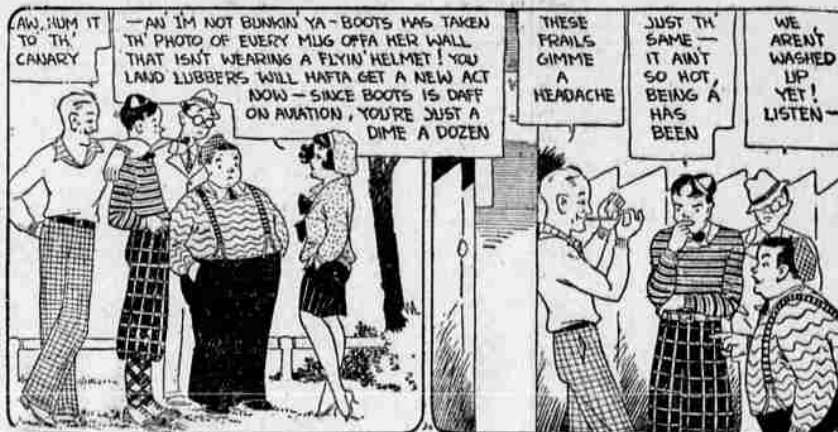
