Markets

BOSTON, April 6.—The Commercial Bulletin today says:

"There has been rather more inquiry in the market during the past week, although the volume of business has not been heavy. Prices on fine wools appear to be fairly well stabilized, although medium wools are not fairly settled to a steady basis, as yet. Demand for goods develops slowly."

"In the west, several hundred thousand pounds of the new clip have been moved this week, more especially in western Idaho, at 35 to 36¢ cents for mixed clips. Most dealers have considered these prices too dear, at least for the average run of the wool available."

"The foreign markets are very slow, with the season nearly over in the primary markets of the southern hemisphere."

"Mohair is dull and prices difficult to quote in the absence of sales. Buyers and growers still are rather wide apart on prices for the new clip."

The Commercial Bulletin will publish the following wool quotations tomorrow:

Scoured basis—Oregon: Fine and f. m. staple \$1.03-1.05; fine and f. m. fr. combing 98-1.02; fine and f. m. clothing 96-98; valley No. 1, \$1.02-1.05.

Mohair: Original bag average 12 months Oregon 58-60.

Grade stock: First combing 65-70; good carding 45-50.
