BODY OF MRS. H. L. BEARD WILL REACH CORVALLIS SAT.

CORVALLIS, April 19.—The body of Mrs. H. L. Beard, accompanied by Captain Harry L. Beard, leader of the Oregon State college cadet band and instructor in the department of mathematics, will arrive in Corvallis Saturday night at 8:15. The funeral will be from the Madison Street Methodist church with Dr. E. J. Harper officiating and Professor Paul Petri directing the music. Interment will be in Crystal Lake cemetery. The time and hour of the service will be announced later.

Mrs. Beard was Miss Kate Adams, the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Adams of Myrtle Creek. She attended and graduated from Oregon State college and was a member of the class of 1908, having completed the course in commerce. Following her graduation she was married to Captain Beard and the couple had since resided in this city.

Surviving are the husband and three children, Norman, the oldest of two sons, is a member of the army band at Vancouver Barracks, Wash. Howard, 12, and Jean, 6, were with Mr. and Mrs. Beard in New York. There are several brothers and sisters, Mrs. D. Vorse of Corvallis being a half sister. Her people were members of a pioneer family of Myrtle Creek and a brother is still in business at that place.

Mrs. Beard had for a number of years been one of the most active members of the Madison Street Methodist church. She was elected president of the College Folk club several years ago, but home duties caused her to resign that position. She had held numerous committee offices, however, and was a tireless and active worker in the organization. Mrs. Beard was also affiliated with other organizations, including the Daughters of the Nile and social groups.

The house appropriations committee, which usually passes upon all government expenditures and prepares the bills making funds available, however, has not been organized for the special session.

While, in the ordinary course of events, the matter could be brought before the appropriations committee at the opening of the regular session, some of the farm leaders in the house feel that because of the emergency nature of the legislation and the desire of the president to have the board able to function for marketing this year's crop, its fund should be provided before that time.

probably will be fully developed with the transmission to the senate agriculture committee of the conclusions of the departmental experts on the operation of such a system.

It was disclosed today at the White House that experts in the agriculture, treasury and commerce departments have been making an intensive study of the proposal since the senate agriculture subcommittee called on President Hoover recently to ask his opinion on the debenture proposition.

While President Hoover declined to give an off-hand opinion to the subcommittee, explaining he had not had an opportunity to study the plan in detail, it is known that the chief executive is opposed to what he regards as a "bounty" system of farm relief.

He believes the house bill, without this feature, points the way to a good start on a program for placing agriculture on a level with other industries.

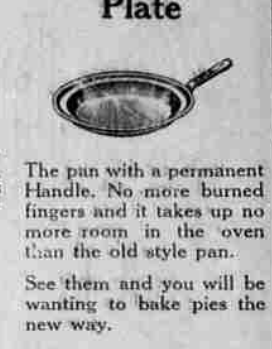

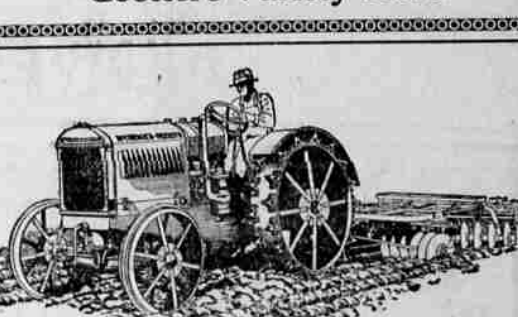
