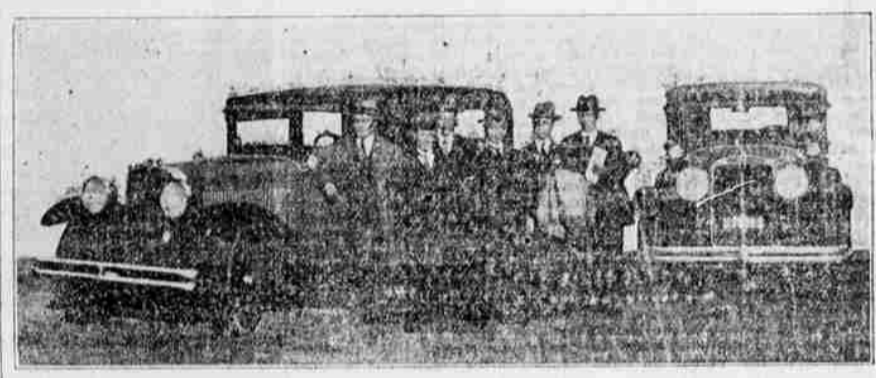

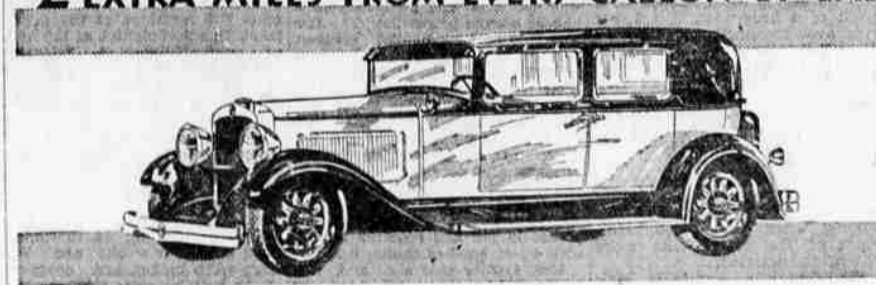
JAPAN DELEGATES APPROVE NASH "400"
